CAPTAIN EDWARD G. ELLIS

Captain Edward G. Ellis, 70, veteran Columbia river steamboat master, died Saturday at Portland General hospital following an operation. He had been in poor health since his retirement from active service about a year ago.

Born in Washington D. C., but reared at Seaside, Or., he had been steamboating in the Columbia river district about 45 years, starting as a deck hand on the old Telephone, and later on the old Thompson and the Cascades. He was pilot on the Telegraph in 1907 when Captain Arthur Rigg's was master and later served for several years as master of the Ca'dwell, a towboat.

Transferring to the upper Columbia river for several years, Captain Ellis was pilot of The Dalles City. During the last 25 years he had worked for Western Transportation company on various steamers and towboats.

Surviving relatives include his widow, Mrs. Leonard Foster of North Bonneville; two grand children; two brothers, John of Beaverton, and James of Portland, and a sister Ruby of Seattle.

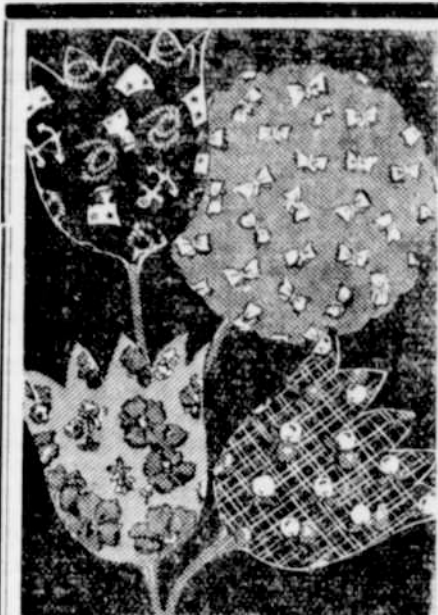
