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Highway Building Costs

Not Limited to 'Surface'
What is a road? Motorists, despite their constant use of highways, might have a difficult time answering that question.

Evidence indicates that the average motorist considers a road, from the standpoint of construction cost, as a slab of surfacing material over which he drives his car. He ignores the elements represented in the right-of-way and the establishment of grades and laying of base materials.

The fundamental factors are fairly permanent; in other words, not subject to destruction nor to maintenance and replacement costs. The right-of-way, for instance, is paid for once and then may be forgotten. If the grade is established to conform to official standards—and it must be if it is partially financed by federal aid funds—then it, too, is subject to but a single initial cost.

With road experts making enormous progress in their efforts to salvage base materials, about the only factor which is subject to deterioration and wear is the actual surface. If the motorist thinks of this feature as the entire road, he may get a false impression of the longevity of the highway which he builds, although modern expensive surfaces do show vastly improved durability.

In connection with their advocacy of a better comprehension of what actually constitutes a road, highway officials would have another aspect of highway life more thoroughly understood. It is that relating to the effect of traffic upon surface destruction. The most searching of all investigations conducted by federal scientists reveal that it is not the service it is called upon to render so much as the climatic conditions which it must resist that determines the degree of maintenance that a given highway will require.

Italy's Synthetic Fruits
Although Italy has no need to develop synthetic fruits as part of the self-sufficiency campaign, since millions of tons are raised in the country every year, Sicilian sweets makers still make a fine art of concocting artificial lemons, oranges, apples, pears, and even strawberries out of candy, some of which are so perfect that taste is the only means of distinguishing them from the real thing.

Stories of Horatio Alger

Are Popular at Harvard
Harvard men seem to be the only ones around Boston who still read the stories of Horatio Alger Jr. The newsboys, about whom Alger used to write, are little interested. At the Burroughs Newsboys' foundation in Boston the members prefer Tarzan.

Alger, who died in 1899 at Natick, Mass., at the age of 67 years, was graduated from Harvard in 1852. The Harvard library has about 25 titles, many the gift of the author, writes Mary Elizabeth Prim in the Boston Transcript. They circulate, too, and are slowly gaining in popularity. Records show that the books seldom went out in the 1920s, but have been in demand during the last few years.

The librarians can't figure whether this is due to loyalty to a fellow alumnus or a belated interest in the methods of the newsboys and others in the street trades about whom Alger wrote with such gusto. All Alger's lads had one thing in common. They made a lot of money and made it quickly. The Alger heroes were honest and eager, but they certainly got the breaks. There was invariably a rich, kindly old gentleman to make them junior partners.

There are a number of Alger's books in the Boston Public library, including his Harvard class ode, but none of them circulates. Several are in the rare books collection.

The public library in Chelsea, where Alger was born, has not a single title of his on the shelves.

'Man Without a Country'

Flys His Flag of Peace
George Dibbern, literally the "man without a country," has solved the problem of how to live a life of peace, in a world of turmoil and uncertainty.

When his 32-foot ketch passed through the Golden Gate and headed for anchorage in San Francisco bay, customs officials flashed out the request of "Who are you?"

Dibbern flashed back the reply, "Te Rapunga."

"That didn't tell customs officials much."

So they flashed back, "What country?"

Dibbern promptly replied: "No country."

"What flag?" the customs officials persisted.

Dibbern promptly ran up his flag. The flag had a white square, a circle and a star.

Customs officials had never seen or heard of such a flag and so far as they knew it was not registered in any part of the world.

So, eventually, they got together with Dibbern and threshed out the mystery.

The name of the ship, Te Rapunga, Dibbern explained, means in Maori, "just before dawn."

He told them how it came about that he has neither a country nor a home except his ketch. He further explained that the flag, which he had hoisted, was his own, as he is not entitled to raise the flag of any nation.

The white square on his own flag, he said, stands for "World Friendliness"; the circle "Unity," and the star "Humanity's aspiration."

Then he told how it had all come about.

For nine years he has sailed the seas under his self-created emblem. The flag has puzzled customs and immigration officers.

A dozen nations refused to recognize it, but that is all right with Dibbern, because none of them has a right to take it from him, because he is a man without a country, a citizen of the world, and no nation has any jurisdiction over him.

patrolling the Atlantic for us. In addition, we must spend at least \$3,000,000,000 more per year to maintain a sufficient air and land force to back up the two fleets. We would need an Atlantic navy because we cannot afford to take our present fleet out of the Pacific. Not only must we protect ourselves against Germany, but also against Japan. Her navy is growing by leaps and bounds. It is difficult to get accurate figures, but many observers believe the Japanese navy is now about 75 per cent as large as ours. One of the biggest reasons for the gain is the act that Japan get twice as much ship for every dollar she spends as we do.

The wide disparity in costs is due to the varying prices for labor and materials. There is no eight-hour day in Japan, no five-day week, no labor unions. We are furnishing Japan with many of the essential materials with which she builds her battleships. To Der Fuehrer and H. Duce, the United States is crazy to needs to build a huge navy whose supply Japan with the materials she main purpose is to menace the United States. Hitler and Mussolini would put a stop to such practice in less time than it takes to tell about it. In the tremendous defense job that faces us, nothing—neither labor leaders nor wage-hour restrictions—must be allowed to stand in our way as they did in France.

More Efficiency Needed

If Germany's blitzkrieg wins, we will be living in a hostile world. Totalitarian governments will face us on all sides. For our own security, we must inject some of the efficiency of the dictator nations into our own democracy. As the first move toward such a goal, we need a spiritual awakening which will emphasize that courage is the only security and progress comes only through willingness to sacrifice. There is no question that Hitler chose 1940 because he was sure there was nothing to fear from American intervention. He knew that 1940 would be a year of political disarmament in America.

Many suggestions have been made in the last few days calling for a coalition government. My feeling is that whoever wins the election this November should include in his Cabinet representatives from ALL parties. Whether we get into the war or not, there are great sums to be spent and great problems to be solved. These vast sums should be expended and these problems should be tackled under the direction of a Coalition Cabinet. "Politics" must be prevented from handicapping us in this gigantic task. Moreover, as a solution of our domestic problems, it will give the nation renewed confidence if all candidates will promise to bring a Coalition Cabinet to Washington!
