Clarence Faris, a recognized choral conductor and voice teacher in Portland, is offering to the nearby communities a chance for membership into two choral units.

The American Folk Song Singers, if you enjoy singing Old Black Joe, and Home on the Range, you will like this group and the A Cappella Singers of Portland, a serious group, singing the best in unaccompanied music.

Mr. Faris formerly Director of Music at the First Presbyterian church, Portland, and at present director of the Rose City Methodist church, and has directed the Philharmonic chorus of 300 voices which sang in the Portland Symphony Orchestra Radio Choral groups in all the Portland stations.

He was tenor soloist with the famous Westminster Choir of Princeton N. J., and sang in all the leading concert halls and opera houses of the U. S. and Europe, it was while listening to a concert in Glasgow, Scotland, by the famous Orpheus male chorus that the director of that chorus made the statement "Who knows but what some day the singers of the world, may be the Peace makers of the world."

Mr. Faris feels that the time has come for every one to be in harmony with his neighbor and to sing the simple songs of our own America, in a sincere manner and for the sheer joy of singing, that is the motive behind this singing.

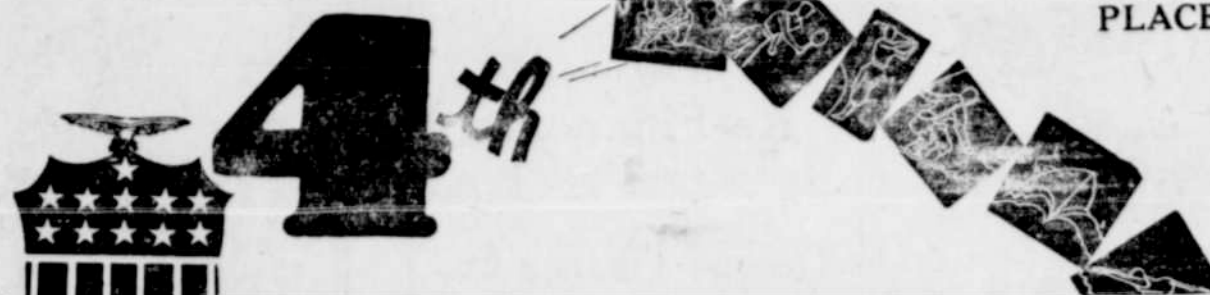
