

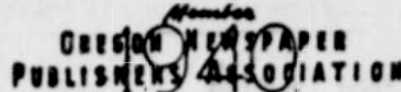

## Washington News Letter

Is this a square deal? Some States have received direct payment from the Government amounting to much more than the internal revenue receipts of the States amounted to, while others have received much less. It is interesting to note that from 1933 through 1937, the internal revenue collected in Alabama was \$41,698,196, while direct payment from the Government to Alabama during this same period was \$168,041,976.

Revenue collections of Arizona was \$3,203,375, while direct Government payments to Arizona were \$62,745,350, during this period.

During this period Arkansas revenue collections were \$15,753,183 while the direct payment from the Government to Arkansas was \$47,583,686.

Internal revenue collections of Idaho during this period were \$8,387,582, while Idaho received direct payment from the Government of \$66,422,443.

Internal revenue collections of Mississippi were \$12,125,167, while Mississippi received direct payment from Government of \$129,193,129.

Indiana during this period collected \$261,831,629 in internal revenue collections and received only \$242,072,284 direct payment from the Government.

The question is often being asked why some states, particularly those of the South, receive several times

the amount of the revenue collections, while others do not.

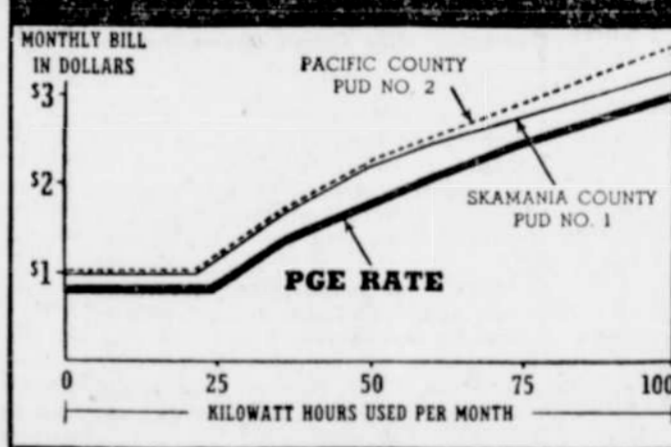

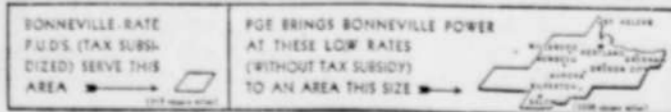
