Registry Office Of Aliens Moved

Registration of aliens, which has been handled at the Main postoffice and the Central station, will be discontinued at those places and instead will be taken care of during the remainder of the registration period at room 208 in the old post-office building, S. W. 6th avenue and Morrison street, it was announced by Postmaster E. T. Hedlund.

The change is effective Monday. December 26 is the final day for registration of aliens under the act of congress. The postoffice reported that a total of 13,748 aliens in the Portland area have registered to date.

fatal accidents in the rain, 12,450 in the fog, and 18,940 in the snow.

Any negligent act of a driver, either in operation or care of a car, may lead to prosecution and imprisonment, according to recent court decisions. These rulings say that any motorist guilty of ordinary negligence which causes death of another, may be convicted of negligent homicide.

It was shown in one case, wherein a conviction was obtained, that the driver allowed his car to get in such poor condition that he could not stop soon enough, and therefore ran down two cyclists. There have been convictions in a number of similar cases.

- 2 COOLING SYSTEM: Inspect for scale and leaks. Inspect hose and clamps.

- 4 CRANKCASE OIL: Inspect level and condition of oil.
- 5 OIL FILTER: Inspect for need of replacement.
