

Local Woman's Needlework Holds Prominent Position In New York Display

Mrs. C. L. Nagel has received national recognition for her fine needlework, and her work will represent this locality in an exhibit of outstanding American crochet to be held in New York City from November 25th to November 30th, it is announced. The exhibition is being held in the Grand Ballroom of the American Woman's Association Clubhouse, and marks the completion of the judging in the Fourth Annual National-Wide Crochet Contest. America's top-ranking crochet will be seen in the dramatic displays, including only those pieces which took first prizes at local, county and state fairs during 1940.

The Population Peak

The National Resources Planning Board estimates that the population of the United States will reach its peak by 1980, with a figure of 158,000,000. In the opinion of the Board, 40 years from now the number of persons from 45 to 65 years of age will be almost doubled, while persons over 64 will be treble the present number.

The Board further predicts that industry will soon be faced with adjusting itself to a decreasing supply of young labor.

Illinois Electrification

The Rural Electrification Administration has announced that the first completely mobile REA-financed generating plant is undergoing final tests preparatory to going into service in Illinois, and that the REA has allotted funds for the installation of two others in the state of Oregon. The Illinois plant, which is about to go into operation, is at Elizabethtown. It will power the lines of the Jo-Carroll Electric Cooperative, an organization of about 600 rural families in Jo-Davies and Carroll counties, to whom the REA has loaned \$349,000 for 278 miles of power lines and two mobile generating units.

Oil Dip Required For Infested Holly

Before infested holly can be shipped out of Oregon it must be treated with an oil dip, the state department of agriculture reports. One hundred gallons of the dip requires two gallons of medium summer oil and 98 gallons of water. A half pound of Pomo or Vatsol as a detergent is not required but adds to oil coverage and kill. Method of using the formula, which should be fresh, is to dip three minutes, drain five minutes, wash in and out in fresh water.
