day is so ignored that every nation believes it is "right" to lie.

Notwithstanding the present tardy lying campaigns of every nation, the world is still getting better. Emille Foltz says that in the 16th century coffee drinking was forbidden in Constantinople "because it stimulated thinking amongst the common people." It is said that the first offense was punished by beating and the second by death! Yet, in my visits to Constantinople, it seemed as though most of the people spent the larger part of the day sipping very strong coffee.

Propaganda in America
We can discount by 66 2/3 the news items from abroad; but it is difficult to keep calm over what is said within this country. The talk about "secret weapons," that a "new world is inevitable," and that "democracy is doomed" is very bad. I also dislike talk about the futility of war and "I did not raise my boy to be cannon fodder." I recently listened to a communist speech stressing the "corruption and oppression" by our "plutocratic democracies." Much of such talk we have heard in the halls of Congress during the past few weeks. Most of it has been honest; but some of it may have been enemy-inspired.

How far shall we go in suppressing such opinions? How can we distinguish between honest opinions of Americans and hired propaganda of foreign agents. It is more and more difficult for conscientious Americans to speak their minds if they disagree with the "higher-ups", or even with their intolerant neighbors. If we get so that those born in the U. S. and Canada cannot freely speak their honest thoughts without being persecuted, is democracy worth fighting for? Certainly, the treatment in some cities of John L. Lewis, Norman Thomas, and Marian Anderson is a disgrace to us all.

Censorship Ahead
Newsmen in Washington have already been photographed and fingerprinted. The Secretary of the Navy has sent a "confidential" letter to newspapers asking them not to print certain facts. While making studies at Washington relative to the war uses and supplies of arsenic, I am at a loss to know whether the Chemical Warfare Service is telling me the truth or stringing me along.

All this reminds me of World War I when I worked for the Committee on Public Information under that able genius, George Creel. Although we now have no such "Committee," yet Mr. Lowell Mellett heads a great press bureau in Washington which, indirectly, has the spending of millions of dollars of taxpayers money. This bureau may be used to lead the taxpayers astray. Although I head a large statistical organization, scouring the country for facts, I am utterly bewildered at times trying to separate the truth from falsehood.

What is the Remedy?
Of course, the real remedy for our difficulty will be found in the twentieth verse of the fifth chapter of Deuteronomy. Since time immemorial, lying has been recognized as one of the ten basic sins. In fact, the only hope of world peace is to get back to the teachings of the Bible which all nations have, for the time being, thrown out of the window.

As a second suggestion, I believe that all persons who are not citizens of the U. S. or Canada should be compelled to keep their mouths shut on political or social matters, especially in connection with the war. My Church friends will not back me up in this. They say that if the U. S. and Canada should prohibit foreign propaganda in their countries, all the Axis Powers and their friends would immediately throw out from their countries all American teachers, preachers, and missionaries, especially those who are paid with money from the U. S. and Canada. So the plot thickens!

Alien Registration

Attorney General Jackson announced 4,741,971 aliens in continental United States and 100,511 aliens in the Territories were registered from July 15, 1940, to January 15, 1941, exclusive of 48,620 alien seamen and 23,038 foreign consular officials and employees.

WPA Gets \$375,000,000

The sum of \$11,987 has been approved for use by the U. S. Forest Service to map and process various data for surveys and maps section of the Service. The work includes making of drawings, tracing maps and coloring and mounting the same; making, trimming and indexing blueprints and photostats; and developing, printing and laying out aerial photographs and preparing indexes to the same.

President Roosevelt signed the \$393,687,775 urgent deficiency appropriation bill. The bill provides \$375,000,000 for the WPA.

The Army

Secretary of War Stimson has announced that between 130,000 and 150,000 selectees will be called for service during March, putting the Army's present strength at 951,000 officers and men, a peace-time record.

Approximately 105,000 of the selectees called during March will be assigned to replacement centers. All but one of the 21 new centers are expected to be ready to train selectees by April 1, Mr. Stimson said. The balance of the men will go directly into existing Army and National Guard units.

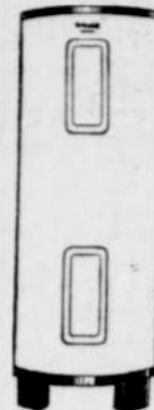
