Indians of Early Washington County

grabbed the Balkans, figuratively speaking. They followed up their advantages by giving tasks to the conquered. They taught them to ride, how to hunt with firearms, how to trap, and established stations where they dealt with offenders and exacted tribute from their vassals. They built up a profitable fur trade with the Hudson's Bay company. They soon tangled with the newcomers whites. A farmer named McLeod fenced his property, somewhere between Hillsboro and Beaverton, and he was careless enough to run the line fence right across an Indian trail, worn down by countless moccasined feet and centuries of travel. The easy going Tualatins would very likely have let the matter pass. But not the Klickitats who were using the trail as a horse path, along which they rode through their domains. They cut the fence and no sooner would McLeod restore it than they again tore it down. The desperate farmer carried the matter to the early court of the county, only to receive a severe setback. The Indians were represented by the Indian Commissioner, who acted as their spokesman, and they argued that the trail was theirs, their highway theirs by the right of conquest. The court decided in their favor. A similar case was brought to court when the Klickitats burned a pile of poles which had been prepared by a settler, for the building of a

cabin. The Indians maintained that the property was theirs by the right of conquest, had never been purchased by the settler. If they wanted to burn some of their poles, why not? The court thought as they did and ruled for them.
Perhaps these incidents had something to do with the urge for the Indian treaties that followed sometime later. There were many among the settlers who were bitter against the Indians and wanted the Government to make suitable payment. They knew that most of the Indian trouble had been caused by their fear that the white men were going to take all the land and kill off all the tribes. They realized the injustice of it all and could not blame the Indians for fighting to preserve their own lives and that of their descendants.
So, on June 3, 1850, more than three years after the Whitman Massacre had taken place as a result of the Indian's belief that Whitman was urging the whites to take over the land and kill all of the natives, Congress passed an act authorizing the appointment of Indian Commissioners and delegating to them certain authorities for dealing with the tribes west of the Cascades. While admitting that he knew little or nothing of Indian conditions in Oregon, the acting commissioner of Indian Affairs in Washington, instructed the newly appointed commissioners for Oregon to extinguish the Indian title to all lands lying west of the Cascades, "and, if possible, to provide for the removal of the whole, from the west to the east of the mountains." And spare no effort, wrote the commissioner, to procure the removal of the tribes as a whole, but failing in this, they could deal with the separate tribes and make treaties. They were allowed an expenditure of \$20,000, to compensate the Indians for the lands given up but only \$5,000 of this was to be in hard cash, the balance to be delivered in goods sent around Cape Horn. This probably suited the Indians a great deal better than the money, for cash itself was not particularly enticing. It lacked the beauty and gaudiness of trinkets and goods.
A story is told of an old Indian who'd performed some service for a white man. He was a good old Indian and had served so faithfully that the white benefactor wanted to reward him, so he ran his hand into his pocket and gave the old fellow two silver dollars. The old Indian took them, somewhat reluctantly, squinted and felt them carefully, then handed them back to the giver. At the same time he pointed to a couple of tarnished brass buttons on the other man's coat and gave a couple of gut-

teral accents. Money meant nothing to him.
