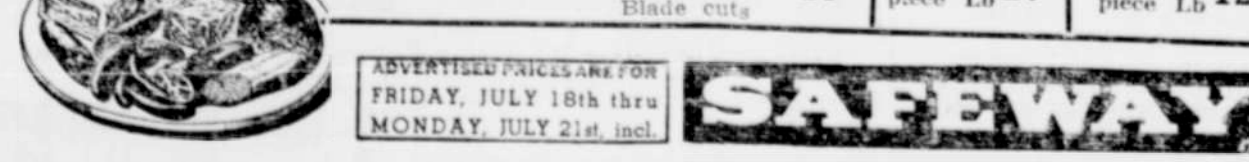

HOW TO REPORT YOUR FIRE

Due to installing Dial telephones a complete change in handling FIRE CALLS is required.

Please Place Calls as Follows:

- 1. Dial 3305 Portland telephones dial "O" operator, and dial Beaverton 3305. For placing Fire Calls ONLY. Other use hinders service. Don't call this number for information.
2. Give your name.
3. Give exact location of fire and owner's name. West Slope District give Hydrant Number.
4. Describe Fire; Grass, Building, etc.

Start NO FIRES with out FIRST getting a State permit from Deputy Fire Warden. (Fire Chief or Road Supervisor).

Answering Fire Calls endangers men and equipment and entails expense. Please avoid false or unnecessary calls.
