Know Your Oregon

FIRST INHABITANTS of OREGON HUGE REPTILES FIRST LIVED HERE DUE TO CLIMATIC CHANGES THEY DISAPPEARED AND WERE FOLLOWED BY LARGE MAMMALS SUCH AS THE ELEPHANT, RHINOCEROS, HIPPOPOTAMUS, SABER TOOTHED TIGER. SKELETONS OF PREHISTORIC ANIMALS HAVE BEEN FOUND IN THE FOSSIL BEDS OF OREGON. SPANISH GALLEONS ON THE COAST OF OREGON IN 1566. BEESWAX, BELIEVED TO HAVE BEEN LEFT BY WRECKED SPANISH SHIPS SAILING FROM THE PHILIPPINES TO MEXICO, HAS BEEN FOUND ON THE BEACHES OF OREGON. IT WAS THE KIND USED BY THE SPANIARDS IN MAKING THEIR CHURCH CANDLES.

LEWIS AND CLARK ROUTE OREGON TRAIL THE OLD OREGON TRAIL AND THE ROUTE OF LEWIS AND CLARK TWO MILESTONES IN NORTHWEST HISTORY. PRESIDENT JEFFERSON DESIGNED THE EXPEDITION OF LEWIS AND CLARK TO THE NORTHWEST IN 1803 WITH THE HOPE OF FURTHERING TRADE WITH THE INDIANS AND TO FOSTER THE SETTLEMENT OF THE WEST BY PIONEERS. THE GREAT ENTERPRISE LED SETTLERS TO TRAVEL FARTHER WEST AND THEIR STEADY TRAVEL OVER THE OLD OREGON TRAIL MADE OREGON AN INSEPARABLE PART OF THE UNION. THE NAME OREGON IS OF DOUBTFUL ORIGIN. JONATHAN CARVER NAMED THE COLUMBIA RIVER OREGON IN 1778. THE POET BRYANT USED THE NAME IN HIS POEM "THANATOPSIS" BUT THERE IS NOTHING DEFINITE AS TO HOW THE NAME OREGON ORIGINATED. OREGON'S FIRST CHURCH BUILT AT OREGON CITY IN 1842 THIS WAS THE FIRST PROTESTANT CHURCH ON THE PACIFIC COAST.

FIVE: - After the Thousand Years, the lost dead will be raised to meet their sins and judgment. The Royal Road - First you count yourself a sinner and lost.
