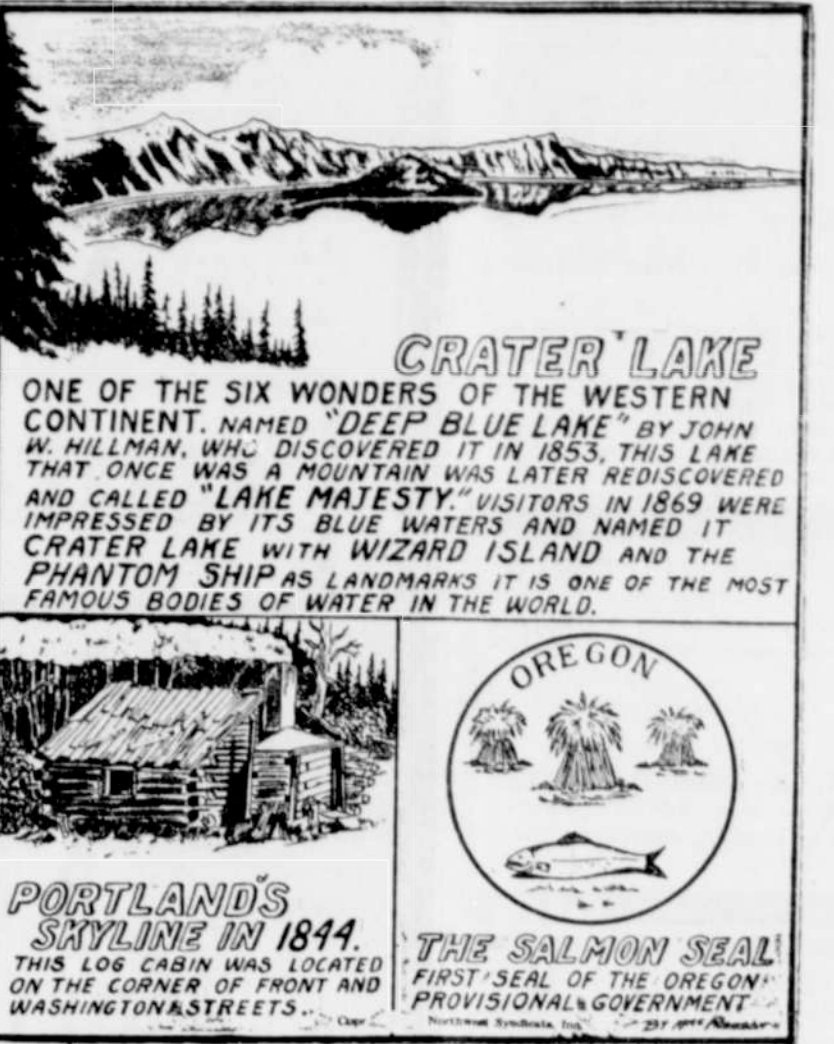

ONE OF THE SIX WONDERS OF THE WESTERN CONTINENT. NAMED "DEEP BLUE LAKE" BY JOHN W. HILLMAN, WHO DISCOVERED IT IN 1853, THIS LAKE THAT WAS A MOUNTAIN WAS LATER REDISCOVERED AND CALLED "LAKE MAJESTY." VISITORS IN 1869 WERE IMPRESSED BY ITS BLUE WATERS AND NAMED IT CRATER LAKE WITH WIZARD ISLAND AND THE PHANTOM SHIP AS LANDMARKS. IT IS ONE OF THE MOST FAMOUS BODIES OF WATER IN THE WORLD.

"We Still Want Townsend Plan"

"There must be no misunderstanding in the minds of Townsend members, or of the general public. The Townsend Plan does not stand for inadequate pensions of \$20 or \$30 a month.
"The Townsend Plan is a scientifically-balanced plan which will finance an adequate national old-age pension by a 2 percent tax on gross incomes over \$3,000 a year. The pension to be paid under this plan would begin, according to present estimates at about \$50 a month and increase as national recovery was brought about.
"It is the purpose of the Townsend Plan to provide a national old-age pension geared to America's capacity to produce abundance for all of her citizens, and thus bring about a stable national economy. No half measures can ever be embraced in the Townsend philosophy."
