Vealers, good to choice \$12 to \$13.

**HOGS:** Good to choice carlots \$10.65; 170 to 215 lb. truckins \$10.50 to mostly \$10.65; 230 to 285 lb. butchers \$9.75 to \$10.15; light weight butchers \$9.75 to \$10.15; packing sows \$8 to \$8.75. Feeder pigs \$10.25 to \$12.

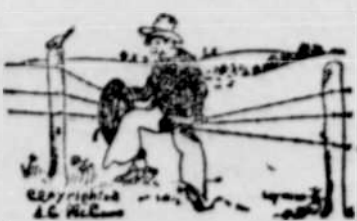

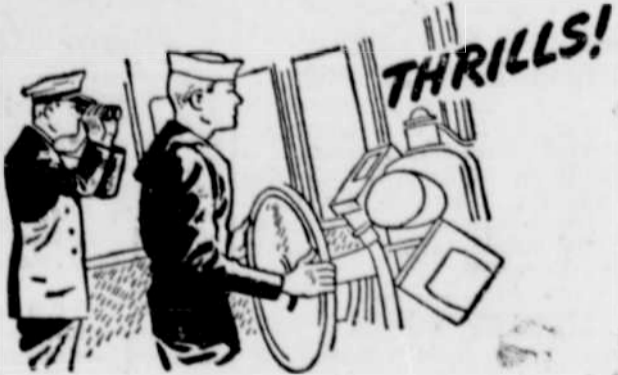

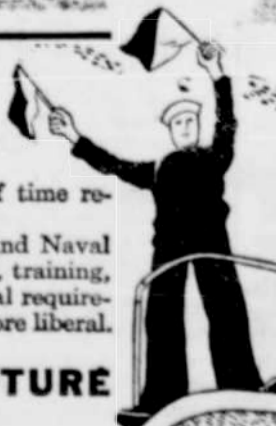
