an old saying in Wall Street that high commodity prices precede lower stock prices." My Comment:—Although commodity prices have advanced considerably during the last year, they are as nothing compared with what they were during World War 1. For instance, in World War 1 wheat sold at \$3.40 per bushel; cotton sold at 38 cents per pound; copper sold at 37 cents per pound; steel sold at \$100 per ton; and sugar you couldn't buy, beg, or steal! 6 "The fact that money rates are controlled by the Federal Reserve Banks makes many wary of buying securities dependent upon money rates. They claim that the low rates received on good bonds, savings, etc., are a great detriment to the situation." My Comment: For 40 years I have been watching securities. Until the past year a surplus of money and low rates have always been given as the basis of a bull market. Why the change? Inflation is coming 7 "Although the stock market can never safely be forecasted by charts, yet there is something in studying the technical position of the market. These market technicians claim that their charts do not now look very good." My Comment: If these chart technicians could tell by their charts whether the stock market is going up or down, they wouldn't be working in back rooms in Wall Street offices for thirty-five dollars a week! Enough said! 8 "The bears insist that the public have been fed up on the inflation argument and are no longer interested in it. Hence, they refuse to accept this as an argument for higher stock market prices." My Comment: I don't look forward to any radical inflation that is going to wreck this country; but I do believe that we are experiencing some inflation all the time and that it is going on at the rate of about 10% a year. Certainly, anyone with common sense will try to hedge against inflation by now buying certain common stocks.

9 "The labor situation is a sufficient reason for the present stock market inactivity." My Comment: It is true that corporations, as a rule, do not make as much money after they are organized under a labor union as they did before. On the other hand, investors are free to shift from companies that are unorganized. Instead of squawking about the stock of some company which has been recently organized by the CIO why not sell that stock and buy stock in some chain merchandizing corporation which will benefit from these increased wages? 10 "Finally, there is the War. Investors are now selling stocks because they are afraid that Russia is to get a licking, whereas a few years ago these same people were selling stocks because they thought Russia was going to control all of Europe!" My Comment: I am

100% for Great Britain, but I have sense enough to see that this entire War is a great paradox. The only hope for world peace is to have Europe consolidated under one control, and yet we are fighting the man who is trying to bring this about! Hitlerism will be smashed; but some of his ideas will live and World War II will be worth all it costs! The truth is that the world has always been at war and investors who will look at war as one of the normal events of life will fare best in the end.
