Advices Putting Farm Machinery in Order During Winter Months

Putting every farm machine in working order this winter for duty next spring and summer will be to the advantage of local farmers to an even greater extent than usual, says county agent W. F. Cyrus. With the manufacture of new machinery and equipment in 1942 sharply curtailed because of defense demands on supplies of steel, copper, and other metals, farmers will have to depend more on existing machinery.

John W. Kamna, chairman of the Washington county USDA agricultural defense board, points out that the food for defense program calls for a high total production of farm crops, milk, eggs, and other products. To meet the producing needs of this increased farm output will require adequate farm machinery. Since there undoubtedly will be more difficulty and more time involved in getting replacements and in getting materials for repairs, it is highly important to the production of food and to the farmers' own financial return that repairs and replacements of parts be anticipated now and equipment put in proper order well in advance of the season of its use. "Checking all farm machinery and ordering any needed parts immediately is the first step in preparing for the coming season," stated Kamna. Early orders offer the best assurance that farmers will obtain parts. Enough steel and other metals will be available to manufacturers to meet the indicated needs for replacement parts. Blacksmith and repair shops have recently been given a defense rating of A-10 the county chairman announced. This will enable them to obtain materials needed for farm equipment repairs.

Secretary of the Navy Knox announced last week that, as part of the Navy Recruiting program for providing men to man the Two-Ocean Navy, the Bureau of Navigation has developed a training program which has resulted in 5,000 enlisted men being assigned each month to the many trade schools either operated by the Navy itself or in conjunction with other educational agencies. Secretary Knox paid high tribute to the patriotism of Henry Ford in making available facilities for the Navy Service school at the Ford Motor Company plant in Dearborn, Michigan.
