YOUNG M. D. TELLS WHY

You get to know the passengers on the Pullman and so it was that the young M. D. opened his heart to tell why he had rejected the Christian faith.

"I only believe what can be proved by science. It follows that the Christian teaching is out with me, for there is no law to prove it. So he ruled out the Bible as to Christ. Fewer Motorists Ask For Licenses

A material reduction in the number of 1942 automobile license applications received up to January 6 this year as compared with the number received during the same period a year ago was reported by Secretary of State Earl Snell Friday.

Records show that up to January 6 this year the state motor vehicle department received 245,733 applications for 1942 licenses, a year ago the applications numbered 254,139.

The decrease this year was 8406. Snell previously had estimated that more than 450,000 license plates would be issued during the entire year ending December 31, 1942.

According to a communication received today at the Portland Navy Recruiting Station, this district still maintains its record breaking pace for enlistments in proportion to population.

Figures released by L. E. Denfield, Asst. Chief of the Bureau of Navigation, give Portland's area an enlistment ratio of 90.89 men per 100,000 population for the month of December, believed to be the highest rate in history.

In the second place was Seattle, with a ratio of 77.03 per 100,000. Los Angeles, San Diego, and San Francisco follows closely, in that order.

The fact that the west coast rate of enlistments far surpasses that of any other portion of the country indicates the temper of the population of this coast which is nearest Nippon.

Oregon District Most Productive Recruiting Center in United States

The old year really roared out like a lion at the Navy Recruiting Station in Portland, headquarters for recruiting activities in Oregon, eastern Washington and northern Idaho. Recruiters have been on the job 24 hours daily since December 7th, and state that the response to the Navy's call for men has been a veritable stampede.

That the unceasing virgil of the recruiting personnel has paid dividends is attested to by the fact that this district leads the entire nation in enlistments per 100,000 of population.

The month of December saw a total of 1388 men joining the Navy in Portland, the largest number in the history of the station. During the month a total of 2335 men were examined by the medical department of the station. Only 623 were rejected for physical reasons, mostly because of faulty teeth and vision.

A mathematically minded recruiter figured out that the months recruiting activity gave the Navy a total of 106,77 tons of young Oregon manhood, the average weight being 153.85 pounds. If laid end to end the men would stretch a distance of 1 1/2 miles. The average height was 68.41 inches.

The single week of December 27th to January 2nd saw the acceptance of 556 apprentice seamen, 35 men in more advanced rates in the Reserve, 6 re-enlistments and 9 men entered Class V-5 as candidates for Flying Cadet.

The files of the Recruiting Station still contain the names of over 500 men who are yet to be enlisted, and the numbers of new applicants have not diminished to any appreciable degree.

The largest single day's enlistment to date was on Sunday, December 27, when 113 men were inducted.

Lt. G. F. DeGrave, officer in charge of the recruiting Station, pointed out that the Navy has thrown open the gates for juniors and seniors in college to enlist in the reserves until their education is finished, then go into training as Deck Officers, as well as making it possible for sophomores to finish this current year before going into training as Flying Cadets.

He expressed confidence that the Oregon district would hold its position as the nation's most productive Navy Recruiting center, throughout the year.

Wine Council Announces New Delivery Service

Deliveries on five days a week instead of the customary six deliveries will be the new policy of the Wine Council of Oregon. Member wine distributors all over the state of Oregon have voluntarily gone on record as favoring the elimination of one day each week in cooperation with national defense measures, according to Mr. Aubrey Cochella, President of the organization.

"We have agreed to this move," explains Mr. Cochella, "in order to cooperate with national defense projects in the conservation of gasoline, tires and equipment. The new delivery schedule, which will go into effect immediately, should not inconvenience dealers in any way. We urge that dealers cooperate with us in order that we make this contribution to the defense program.

No particular day will be set aside. Various wine distributors will cease deliveries on different days in order that service may not be interrupted.
