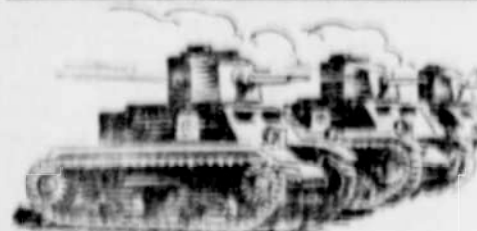

Victory Gardens

GROW YOUR OWN

Cutworms! They live over the winter as a caterpillar and are right on the ground ready to eat when the first plants come up. They like cabbage but will eat anything else they can find. Broadcast a poison bait a few days before you set out garden plants. The following formula will make enough bait for the ordinary city garden. Coarse wheat bran 3 pounds white arsenate or Paris green 3 ounces, and add enough water to make a crumbly mash—usually 2 to 3 quarts.

Do you want a small bulletin listing practically every vegetable insect pest and how they may be controlled? This pamphlet is available from the county agent office.

Have you done anything about those spittle bugs on the strawberries?

Dusting each plant thoroughly with a one-half of one percent rotenone dust as soon as the weather settles will be a good way to get more and better strawberries.

Tomato plants will soon be transplanted. Flea beetles are especially fond of tomato foliage. They feed on the leaves and leave the plant looking like it is going to die if it isn't dead.

Various kinds of dusts will keep the flea beetles away. An especially good one is the same rotenone dust mentioned for spittle bug. Dust the plants just after they are set and keep them covered with a dust coat for the first month.

What causes the brown rot in the blossom end of the tomato? That question is undoubtedly asked hundreds of times a year. Usually, we believe always, it is an inadequate amount of moisture. If the tomatoes are being watered and their blossoms and rot try giving them more water and keep it up.

Leafy green and yellow vegetables are excellent sources of the vitamin A active carotenoids. Kale, spinach, escarole, dandelion greens, water cress, turnip greens, lamb's quarter, and parsley are some of the commoner leafy green vegetables that are rich in carotene. In leafy head vegetables such as cabbage and lettuce, the outer green leaves are richer in carotene than the inner leaves. Carrots, yellow-flashed sweet potatoes and ripe tomatoes are excellent sources of carotene.

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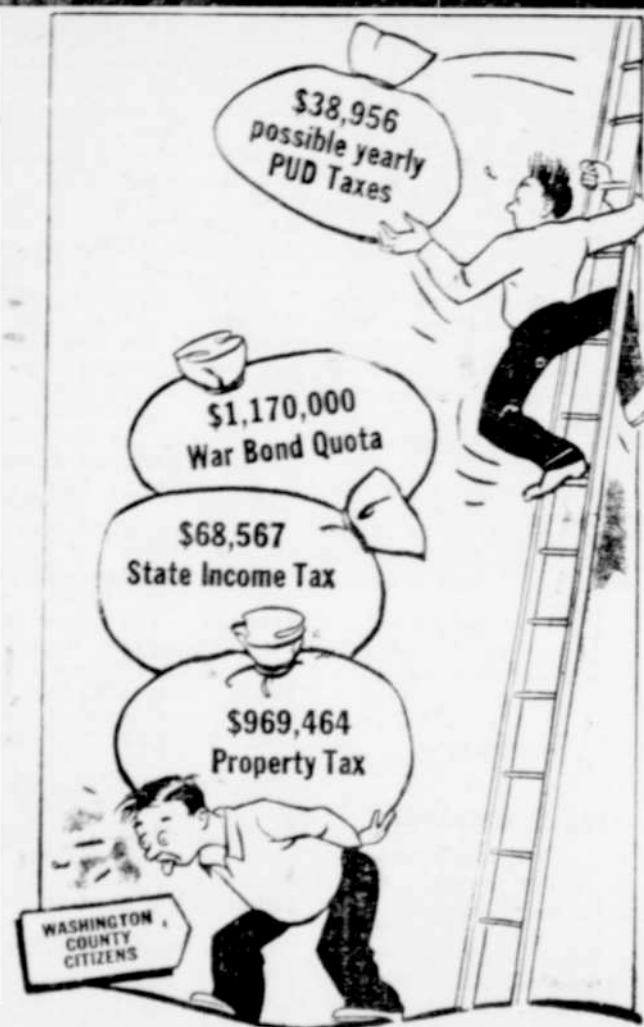

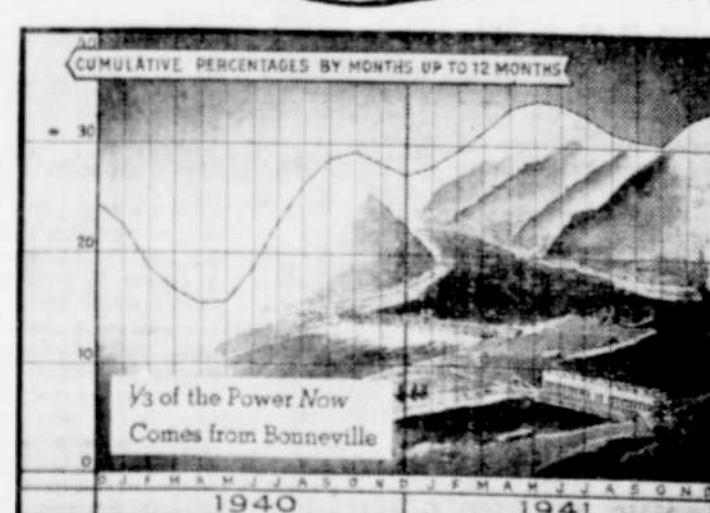
