On the other hand, those which are less expensive and not of the best quality of fastness are useful for certain types of materials.

## Crop Seed Growers Advise dAbout Bags

Washington county growers of winter legume seed crops were advised this week by Wm. F. Cyrus, county agent, to immediately contact their dealers and order the cotton bags they will need to package these years' crop.

The War Production Board has allotted seven and one-half million yards of Osanburg material to bag manufacturers. This is sufficient to make approximately six million agricultural bags according to the war production board's announcement. This material, available for immediate delivery, has been diverted from war purposes to make bags for seed and other crops in the Northwest.

Because of time limitations on the supply of bags that any firm can have on hand, manufacturers and distributors alike have been hesitant to take delivery of bags and material without having definite orders for bags. Unless this material, which has been set aside for seed bags, is used by manufacturers very soon it will be used for war purposes or diverted to other areas for grain bags, the county agent has been informed.

Every grower of peas or vetch, or other winter legume seed crops, should order at once the bags he will need or a serious situation may arise at harvest time, the county agent said. Besides being needed for war purposes, cotton fabrics are in demand to replace burlap for grain bags and the material allocated for these seed bags must be used or it will be taken for other purposes.

## Victory Gardens

Those who are accustomed to having fresh vegetables delivered right to their door every day may find that the Victory garden offers a way out. Curtailment of truck and delivery service in the interest of rubber and gas conservation will have the effect of making fresh vegetables less easily obtained from the customary delivery services. Deliveries will be less frequent and, perhaps, discontinued entirely for some areas. By growing vegetables in the home garden a steady and easily available supply will be provided when succession plantings of vegetables are made throughout the season. Beets planted by June 10 will be ready for use, with reasonable care, by August 1 to 10; lettuce, August 10 to September 15; carrots August 25; cabbage, September 1 to 30; turnips, August 10 to 20; rutabagas, September 10; tomatoes, September 10 to 30; sweet corn, August 25 to September 15; and bush beans, August 10 to 30. Plantings of leafy green vegetables may be continued throughout June, July, and August. There are many locations where succession plantings of vegetables for fresh use can be made during June and July to insure a steady home supply.

Extension Circular 377, A Monthly Schedule of Suggested Operations in Growing Vegetables for Home Use, has vegetables listed for planting in June. Get a copy at the county agents' office.

This is the time the flea beetles start eating on tomatoes, beans, squash, and other garden crop. Tomatoes are one of their favorites. Rotenone dust sprinkled lightly on the plants once or twice a week will keep them away. The plant does not need to have a heavy coat of dust—just a light dusty covering.

Flea beetles are particularly disastrous on potatoes. They not only injure the top of the plant but there is one species of this beetle that works down into the ground and burrows into the skin of the young tuber. When the potatoes that have worked on by flea beetles are peeled an extra thick peeling must be made in order to get rid of the black discolored burrows left in the flesh of the potatoes just under the skin. One hundred percent control of flea beetles on potatoes cannot be expected.

ed. If control is attempted it is necessary to keep the potato plant covered with the dust from the time it comes through the ground until the vines begin to die. That will mean usually six or seven dustings at intervals of about seven to nine days.

The 12-spotted cucumber beetle which works on beans, squash, cucumbers, and a few other plants, is one of the really hard insects to control. This beetle can be readily identified because it lives up to its name. It is yellow in basic color with 12 black spots on its back. Some kind of pyrethrum dust has proven effective in controlling this cucumber beetle. Rotenone may be of some benefit but pyrethrum in some form is recommended.
