The Grower and Income Tax

Presuming that the income of the fruit grower and farmer in this and the coming years is going to incur the payment of income taxes, it is going to be something more than just a convenience to be in a position to determine net income on a year's operations. Production Credit corporation officials are fully alive to this, as may be realized from the statement recently made by C. R. Arnold, Production Credit commissioner.

A farmer who sells his products for, say, \$5,000 gross certainly should deduct his expected income tax before he can figure his net returns. He will do well to figure probable income tax as part of his anticipated cost of production, for he is going to have to pay it just as surely as he has to pay a tax on his land, and the chances are good that he can figure an increasing income tax for the next several years.

Many farmers already figure expenses this way, but more are going to have to do it in the future, including borrowers of short-term production money from the production credit associations. In fact, dairy farmers and others with a fairly steady income, should, as a business-like procedure, budget their income tax, where it is considerable, by setting aside a certain amount monthly with which to pay it.—Hood River News.

Federated Garden Club Board Discuss Activities

The executive board of Oregon Federated Garden clubs met at Medford July 21, to discuss fall activities, particularly district meetings and harvest shows, according to Mrs. M. A. Lawrence of Multnomah, vice-president. The next board meeting will be held at Hood River in October.

Two awards to be given by the federation, one for excellence in horticultural achievement and the other for the best year book, were also discussed.

Tentative plans were made for the district meetings this fall so these can be held in sequence to save traveling for the president.
