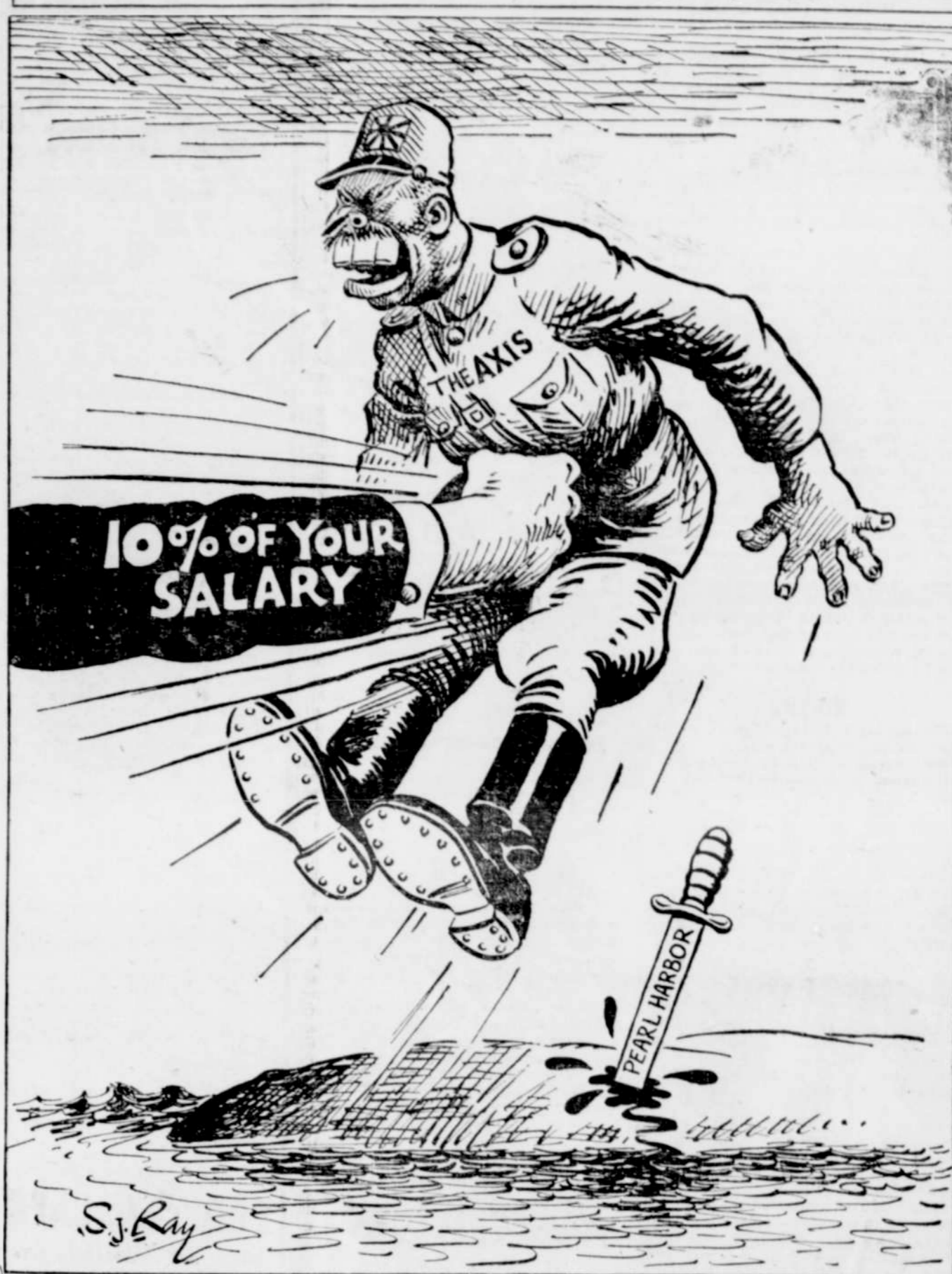

Mrs. America Goes To War

Mrs. America's children will get a taste of what war means... they'll probably be tasting more butter than ice cream and more cocoa than chocolate candy novelties as a result of two War Production Orders.

It may seem to be a far cry from the perfume bottle on milady's dressing table to synthetic rubber and smokeless gunpowder, but all three require alcohol, so in order to save an additional million gallons of ethyl alcohol each year for military production the amount which can be used for toiletries and cosmetics is under War Production Board restriction.

Here's good news for Mrs. America. A new broom may sweep clean, but some 40,000 vacuum cleaners have just been released for sale to civilians. These are from stocks of manufacturers and private brand sellers, and had been frozen by the War Production Board since October 24.

Civilian use of alpaca for clothing, upholstery fabrics or draperies has been prohibited. The limited supply of this material in this country will be used entirely for the armed forces, particularly for uniforms to be worn by troops stationed in cold climates.
