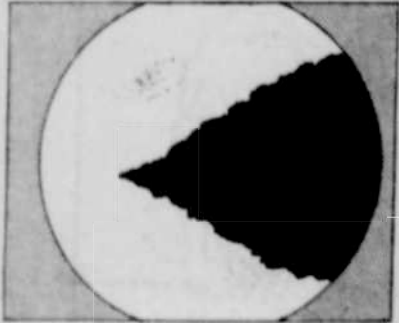

3. Portable, operating from ordinary power lines, it is expected to speed war research in laboratories of colleges and war plants.

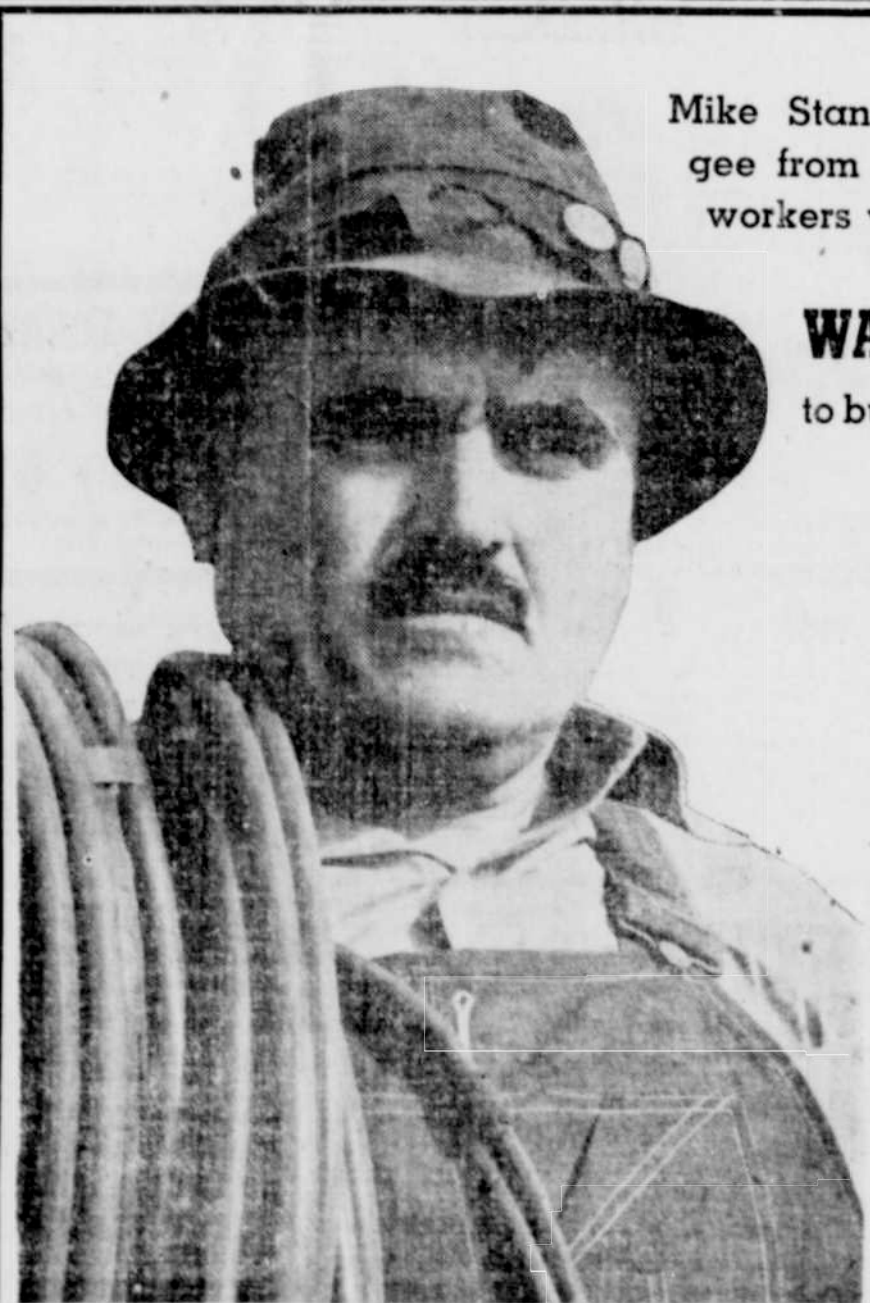
