When to Plant

Four important steps that home gardeners can be taking now to keep present plantings growing to the fullest extent and in planning for the future harvests are weeding, pest control, watering and successive plantings for a long season of harvest.

Weeding and pest control are the first two essentials for the success of crops already planted. As to watering and irrigation, all gardeners do not have water available. Good irrigation should wet the soil to a depth of 12 to 18 inches about every 10 days.

Some of the warm weather crops that can be planted now are listed with probable limitations as to planting dates.

Turnips may be planted July 15 to Sept. 1.

Swiss chard, until mid-July.

Radishes, thru Sept. and early Oct.

Broccoli, set out plants now to July 30.

Cabbage, set out plants now to July 20.

Chinese cabbage, July 15 to Aug. 10.

Cauliflower, now to Aug. 1.

Onions for eating green may be planted to August 15.

Leaf lettuce can be used 40 to 45 days after planting if kept growing vigorously.
