No Corn for Liquor

Corn cannot be used for manufacture of distilled spirits and high wines, a recent directive of the War Production Board says. The action was taken to conserve stocks of corn for essential purposes, although the amount of corn saved is likely to be small because distillers already had shifted largely to the use of wheat.

RATION BOOK REMINDER

COFFEE—Stamp No. 22 valid from July 22 to August 11.

SUGAR—Stamps 15 and 16 in war ration book one valid for 5 lbs of sugar each for home canning, good until Oct. 31.

October 31—Canning sugar stamps No. 15, 16 in book No. 1, each good for five pounds, expire.

Housewives may apply at local boards for supplemental home canning rations, if essential.

RED STAMPS—

June 27—Red stamp P valid; stamp Q valid July 4; R on July 11; S on July 18. All expire July 31.

Each weekly series good for 16 points.

BLUE STAMPS—

(Processed fruits and vegetables) Blue stamps N, P and Q valid from July 1 to August 7.

RATION BOOK NO. 3—Initial registration for war ration book No. 3 closed on June 10 and will not be resumed until August 1. OPA announced that postmen are to deliver book No. 3 before July 21 to all who filed proper applications. This book is to be a replacement, when needed, for books No. 1 and 2.

TIRE INSPECTION

Sept. 30 is next tire inspection deadline for A books.

FUEL OIL—

Sept. 30—Period 5 coupons valid March 26 through Sept. 30. Heating coupons—one unit, value ten gallons; ten units, 100 gallons.

GASOLINE—

Sept. 21—No. 7 stamps in A book, each good for 4 gallons, valid thru this date.

TIRES—

Cars with C ration books must have tires inspected every 3 months; B books every 4 months; A books every 6 months. Sept. 30 next inspection deadline for A book holders.

SHOES—

June 16—Stamp No. 18, book No. 1, valid for one pair of shoes through October 31. Stamps interchangeable among family living in same household.

Sugar Stamp No. 14

Valid on August 16

Sugar stamp No. 14 in ration book No. 1 will become valid August 16 and will be good for five pounds through October the OPA announced today. This is on the same basis of previous rations—about one half pound a person a week. The presently valid stamp No. 13 will expire August 15.

Soldier's Life Insurance

Soldiers—at home or abroad—are reminded that less than three weeks remain in which they can get National Service Life Insurance without a physical examination. Until August 10, 1943, every application will be accepted regardless of the individual's medical condition. After August 10 a rigid physical examination will be required.
