RATION BOOK REMINDER

RATION BOOK NO. 4—
Registration for new ration book No. 4 will be October 26 to 29 at the public schools. Applicants must present their copies of book No. 3 to obtain new books. One member may obtain all of a family's books.

RATION BOOK NO. 3—
October 30—Expiration date for brown stamps, C, D, E and F in book No. 3. Series G valid October 24 to Dec. 4. Series H valid Oct. 31 to Dec. 4.

PROCESSED FOODS—
Expiration date for blue stamps X, Y and Z in book No. 2, which became valid October 1.

November 1—Green stamps A, B, and C in new ration book No. 4 become valid for purchasing processed foods. This series valid through December 20.

Retail sales of jams, jellies, preserves and fruit spreads frozen until Oct. 11 when rationing starts with use of blue and green stamps.

SUGAR—
November 1 to January 1—Stamp No. 29 in book 4 valid for five pounds. October 31—Canning sugar stamps No. 15, 16 in book No. 1, each good for five pounds, expire.

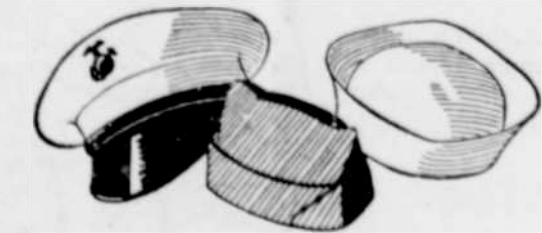
