Use New Tokens February 27

OPA announces that effective 12:01 a. m. Sunday, February 27, all blue and red stamps in ration book No. 4 will have a value of 10 points, each, regardless of the figures now printed thereon.

Blue stamps will be for processed foods; red stamps for meat, fats, oils, cheese and canned evaporated or condensed milk.

Because all blue and red stamps in book No. 4 will have a 10-point value, change will be made with tokens and not with other stamps as at present. You will not receive any tokens until you are given them in change by your retailer when you make a purchase.

Tokens can be used by anyone in the family, and ration books need not be shown.

Three red stamps are valid every 2 weeks period, starting Feb. 27. Five blue stamps will become valid every month, giving a total of 50 points every month. Point values on red and blue stamps will be adjusted to the new 50 and 60 point allotments.

Stamps will continue to become good for approximately 12 weeks, but tokens will be good anytime.

In ration book No. 4 series K, L and M and brown stamps in book 3 Y and Z remain valid until March 20. These stamps will not have a 10-point value as will the red and blue stamps. They will retain their present values. However, tokens will be given in change when purchases are made after Feb. 27.

RATION BOOK REMINDER

Cut this out and keep it in your purse or billfold.

ADVANCE PORK RATION—

OPA has validated these 216 meat points for advance use in purchase of pork on the farm only: Last 96 brown points in book No. 3 and red stamps numbered "8" and lettered "A" through "M" in book No. 4 (each red stamp good for 10 points, regardless of the point value printed on them).

RATION BOOK NO. 3—

Brown Stamps, for purchase of meats, fats, etc.
Feb. 26—Expiration date of brown stamps V, W, and X.
March 20—Expiration date of brown stamps Y and Z.

RATION BOOK NO. 4—

Processed fruit and vegetables
Feb. 20—G, H and J expires.
RATON TOKENS—

February 27—Starting date for use of red and blue ration tokens.

SUGAR—

Stamp No. 40 valid for 5 lbs. home canning sugar.

Jan. 16—Stamp No. 30 valid for 5 lbs. Good Jan. 15 to March 31.

SHOES—

Stamp No. 18 in book No. 1 and stamp No. 1 on airplane sheet in book No. 3 valid indefinitely for one pair of shoes.

FUEL OIL—

Not more than 37 per cent of the season's rations should have been used to date. Period 2 coupons valid Nov. 30 to Feb. 8; period 3, Jan. 4 to March 14. Coupons have 10 gal. unit value with some worth several units.

GASOLINE—

March 21—Expiration date stamps No. 10 in A book (three gallons each).

B-1 and C-1 stamps worth three gallons each. B-2, R-2, B and T stamps 5 gallons; D 1½ gal. E, 1 gallon.

TIRE INSPECTION—

A card autos every 6 months or by September 30 (inspections) must be at least 90 days apart.)

B card autos every 4 months or by October 31 (inspections) must be at least 60 days apart.)

C card autos every 3 months or by Nov. 30 (inspection must be at least 45 days apart.)

Commercial vehicles every six months or every 5000 miles, whichever occurs first.

STOVES—

Purchase certificates obtainable at local ration board.

WOOD, SAWDUST, COAL

Fuel dealers must deliver wood, sawdust and coal on priority based on consumer need, with those having less than three months' supply coming first.

Try adding cooked buttered mushrooms to scrambled eggs.
