

March 29 Set for Public Hearing

A public hearing will be heard on Wednesday, March 29, 1944, at 1:30 p. m. in the office of the Public Utilities Commissioner in 316 Oregon building, Portland, wherein the Oregon Motor Stages want to make some changes in the routing of buses. Application is for abandonment of Market Road 223 from its intersection with Walker Road to its intersection with Market Road 26; Market Road 26 from its intersection Oregon State Highway No. 2 to its intersection with Market Road 223 from its intersection point more commonly defined as Rich's Nursery. In lieu of the proposed abandoned route over Market Roads 223 and 26 as above described, applicant seeks authority for operation over Market Road 215, or more

commonly called Walker Road, from the intersection of Market Roads 215 and 223 to intersection of Market Road 1172 at a point more commonly called Rich's Nursery.

This company has been operating a bus over this route for through passengers but now wants a permit to serve local service.
