voters of the district the following
propositions:
1. Shall District No. 48, Washing-
ton County, Oregon, unite with
School Districts No. 6, 18, 37, 57,
60, 74, 81, 94, 95, 107 and 108, all
of Washington County, Oregon; 62
Jt., Washington County, and 62 Jt.,
Multnomah County, being one joint
district; 67 Jt., Washington County,
and 67 Jt., Multnomah County,
being one joint district; 83 Jt.,
Washington County, and 8 Jt.,
Multnomah County, being one
joint district; and 104 Jt., Wash-
ington County, and omitting 42 Jt.,
Multnomah County, the other por-
tion of said joint district, to form
a union high school district?
