Giant New Bomber Turned Out in U. S.

Super-Super Aerial Weapon Added to U. S. Might.

WASHINGTON. — Representative Sparkman (Dem., Ala.) declared that the aviation industry was turning out a giant new bomber—something better even than the heralded B-29 super-bomber—that would "surprise and hurt" the enemy.

Sparkman, chairman of a house military affairs subcommittee that recently toured aircraft factories, said in an interview that combat crews were now being trained for the new aerial weapon, and indicated that it was designed for operation especially against the Japanese.

He said most of the information gathered by his six-man committee must remain secret, but added: "I wish everybody in the country could have seen what we did."

Starting its tour at Atlanta, the group went south and west as far as San Francisco, visiting factories, training fields and testing grounds. By train and auto they covered more than 10,000 miles, stopping at more than a score of plants, talking to hundreds of factory executives and watching thousands of men and women at work.

Sparkman reported that: 1. The new bomber will add considerably to the strength of Allied air might.

2. Aircraft production quotas are being met.

3. The 9,000 plane per month record now being averaged will rise to about 10,000 in 1944.

4. Enough combat crews are being trained to handle present production and fill gaps caused by casualties.
