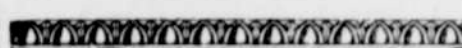

In accordance with the provisions of the "Local Budget Law" (Sections 110-1201 to 110-1215, O. C. L. A., as amended), notice is hereby given that the budget committee of City of Beaverton, Oregon, in compliance with said law, prepared and adopted on May 17, 1944, the budget estimates for City of Beaverton, Oregon, for the ensuing fiscal year July 1, 1944, to June 30, 1945. All persons are hereby notified that on Friday, the 30th day of June, 1944, at 8 p. m., in the City Hall, Beaverton, Oregon, said budget estimates may be discussed with the City Council, the levying board for City of Beaverton, Oregon, and any person subject to the proposed tax levy or tax levies, will be heard in favor of or against said proposed tax levy or tax levies or any part thereof.

The outstanding indebtedness of City of Beaverton, Oregon, at May 31, 1944, consisted of Refunding Improvement Bonds, Series 1939, \$23,500.00, Refunding Water Bond Series 1940, \$32,000.00 and General Obligation Bonds, Series 1942, \$3000.00.
