Community Canning Project Interests Many People
 More than 200 members of the Garden Home Community Canning Association of Garden Home, Oregon, have just jointly and individually completed a workshop at Progress which will turn out 50,000 cans of victory garden vegetables as their added contribution to the war effort, according to Lee Fryer, the canning association's board chairman. "We started our operations in late March and are mighty proud of our community canning center," said Fryer. "Not only for what it stands for, and the spirit in which it was built, but also for what it will mean to our community."
 Garden Home is about nine miles outside of Portland. It is made up of farm people, and commuting Portland workers. Two years of Victory garden planting and well functioning community school lunch programs have given Garden Home people much valuable experience in organizing. Garden Home boasts one of the best community school lunch projects any where to be found in the surrounding area.
 Mr. Fryer was elected chairman and the board was made up of other local members, Dick Hickman, Mrs. Grace Ringsmyer and Mrs. H. A. Davis, who is herself a competent and qualified canning supervisor. A \$5 fee was charged for life membership, and an additional \$25 was charged to each school which had a school lunch program wished to have canned goods available to them. At the very start, three schools were signed up to receive canned foods. More than a hundred families signed life memberships and the board was launched on a real canning project.

Pickers Being Mobilized For Record Bean Harvest
 With the harvest of a record-breaking acreage of snap beans in Oregon just around the corner, the state emergency farm labor office in the OSC Extension service has mobilized its forces throughout the Willamette valley to make the best possible use of boys and girls and women, who will do most of the picking.
 The major portion of this crop, which last year was valued at about \$3,000,000, will have to be harvested by youth and women again this season. A total of 4700 acres, or 400 more than last year, have to be harvested.
 The bean harvest will begin in some areas about July 25, but the peak demand for workers will not come until about the middle of August. County farm labor assistants will recruit these pickers.

Order Fertilizer for Next Year Now, Farmers Advised

Oregon farmers have an opportunity to protect themselves with supplies of fertilizer for next spring by ordering now and accepting early delivery, says Arthur S. King, OSC extension specialist in soils.
 Despite increased allocations of fertilizers available for 1945, supplies will still be short, King predicts. To be safe next spring, he says, it will be necessary for a large number of farmers to buy and store on their farms all or a substantial share of their 1945 fertilizer needs.
 "The 1945 fertilizer supplies are now being offered in this area," King reports. "It cannot be overemphasized that these shipments are part of our 1945 supply. If the dealers do not store or dispose of them, each car refused will detract from what we know will be a serious shortage next year. It all adds up to the fact that Oregon farmers have a chance to protect themselves now. If they do not take advantage of the opportunity, they may be forced to go without fertilizer."
