Men Trained to Bust Pillboxes

Success of Allied Troops in Invasion of Europe Due To Hard Drilling.

WASHINGTON. — Some of the bravest soldiers in the U. S. army—it was a job only for the brave—made the initial land attack on the Fortress of Europe by knocking out pillboxes and other fortifications of the Atlantic wall, says a story released by the war department upon the invasion of Europe.

Assault tactics, perfected in North Africa, Sicily and Italy, were drilled into troops in Great Britain for months before the actual invasion. Special training was given infantry units which were designated for the spearhead of the attack.

The assault on concrete emplacements is one of the most exciting and dangerous operations of modern war. It looks impossible, but it isn't, as American doughboys have proved. The key to success is plain, old-fashioned fortitude, spelled with a capital G.

Originally, the reduction of fortifications was considered a job for engineers. However, after some experiences, it became apparent that it would be more effective to train infantry with special engineer weapons, and this was the technique used in Europe.

Wire Blown to Bits.
The preparation is provided by artillery, by naval guns, by air bombardment and by waterproofed tanks firing hull-down in the water.

There are 30 men in an assault section—29 enlisted men and one officer. This is the capacity of the assault boats, and it is also the most convenient size for attacking a single pillbox.

It is the job of the first men ashore to locate land mines, and mark safe lanes with special tracing strips.

As part of this operation, barbed wire must be cut, and American soldiers have a wonderful weapon for this purpose. It is the Bangalore torpedo, which blows a wide swath through the wire.

Then the other members of the team follow through the wire, and move up the beach.

One of the most dramatic actions of the assault is carried out by the rocket gunners, firing the famous bazookas. Their mission is to attack the pillbox apertures to silence enemy fire, and the accuracy of American rocket gunners is remarkable.

The climax of the entire operation is played by the soldier with the flame-thrower and the man with the demolition charge.

As soon as one pillbox blows, the entire section moves forward for another attack. During a landing operation these tactics are repeated by many squads along a considerable front—there will be at least one division in line, and probably more.

Fear Not 'Secret Weapons.'

All the inventive brains and mechanical skill at the command of Hitler's Germany went into devising and manufacturing weapons with which to combat the Allied invasion of western Europe. But the best they could devise seems to hold no terror for the Yanks.

The results range from fantastic improbabilities employing the farthest advances of a perverted science, through "bright ideas" of common killers, down to battle-suggested improvements of standard weapons.

Before the invasion German propagandists made much capital of "secret" weapons that would turn any tide in their favor at one fell stroke, and some of the actual German equipment lent color to their claims. Most of the secret weapon talk, however, was pretty generally written off as simply hot air.

The Germans necessarily have to rely principally on the unromantic realities of fixed fortifications, artillery, tanks, machine-guns, barbed wire, mines and men with rifles.

Cut this out and keep it in your purse or billfold. **MEATS—FATS—** Book 4 Red Stamps A-8 through D-5 are good indefinitely.

A5, B5, and C5 become good July 30 and remain good indefinitely.

Waste kitchen fats exchanged for two points and four cents a pound.

PROCESSED FOODS— Book 4—Blue stamps A5 through Z8 and A5, valid indefinitely.

SUGAR— Stamp No. 30, 31, 32 in book 4 valid indefinitely for five pounds.

For canning only: Sugar Stamp 40 valid for 5 pounds through Feb. 28, 1945.

SHOES—Loose Stamps Invalid Book 3—Airplane stamps No's. 1 and 2 indefinitely for one pair.

FUEL OIL— Period 4-5 coupons valid through Sept. 30. Place new orders as soon as Period 1 coupons received from local boards.

GASOLINE COUPONS— Not Valid unless Endorsed A No. 12 valid thru Sept 21—3 gal each.

B3—or C3—may be renewed within but not before 15 days from date on cover.

WOOD, COAL, SAWDUST— ORDER NOW! Don't risk shortage next winter.

TIRE INSPECTION— Records must be presented for gasoline renewals, special application and tire replacements.
