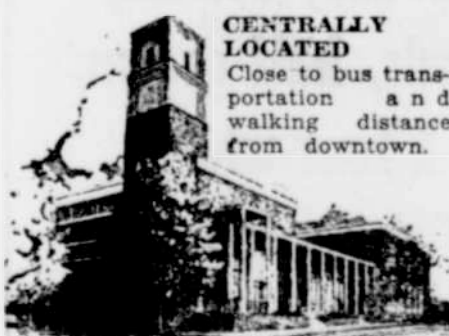

feed emergencies should seek them
through the regular channels, reports
Palmer S. Torvend, county agent, ac-

creased production of pellets. These
increased supplies will be available
through regular trade channels and
not through the government set-aside
allocation.
