Discharged Personnel To Travel at One Half Fare

Because of an order authorized to-
day by Public Utilities Commissioner
George H. Flagg, Oregon personnel
now being discharged from the
United States Army, the Navy, the
Marines, or the Coast Guard will be
able to reach their homes with more
of their discharge pay in their pocket-
ets. Flagg approved a plan that will
allow discharged personnel to travel
at half fare on all railroads. The
rate takes effect September 1, with the
usual privilege of completing the jour-
ney in 30 days.

His action will have the approval of
the Interstate Commerce Commission.
Mr. Flagg is assured, and is likely to
be placed in effect by all other state
commissions. The military branches
are said to be discharging thousands
of men at this time, as well as send-
ing home those who have completed
hospitalization.

Round trip tickets will also be
sold to furlough men at one and one
quarter cents per mile, which is a
little less than one-half fare on most
railroads.

Civilians will not be entitled to the
special rates.
