Nazi War Products Are Now Being Made for U. S.

NEW YORK.—General Aniline
and Film corporation has made
available for use against the Nazis
two German-discovered war prod-
ucts important in manufacturing
electronic equipment, said a report
by George W. Burpee, president of
the once German controlled com-
pany, which was made public.

Production of the two products,
poelectron resins and carbonyl iron
powder, was only one of the war
accomplishments of General Aniline,
said a report which Burpee submit-
ted to Alien Property Custodian
James E. Markham and his pre-
decessor, Leo T. Crowley. The cus-
todian holds 98 per cent of the voting
stock.

"The company has been thoroug-
ly Americanized," Burpee's report
said. "All connection with I. G.
Farben (the former parent German
company) through members of the
management has been terminated
through the installation of the new
management."
