Waste kitchen fats exchanged for two points and four cents a pound.

PROCESSED FOODS—
Book 4—Blue stamps A5 through W5 valid indefinitely.

Blue Stamps X-5 to B-2 became valid Dec. 1.

SUGAR—
Stamps No. 30-34 in book 4 valid indefinitely for five pounds.

For canning only: Sugar Stamp 40 valid for 5 pounds through Feb. 28, 1945.

SHOES—Loose Stamps Invalid
Book 3—Airplane stamps No's. 1 and 2 and 3 good indefinitely for one pair.

GASOLINE COUPONS—
Not Valid unless Endorsed

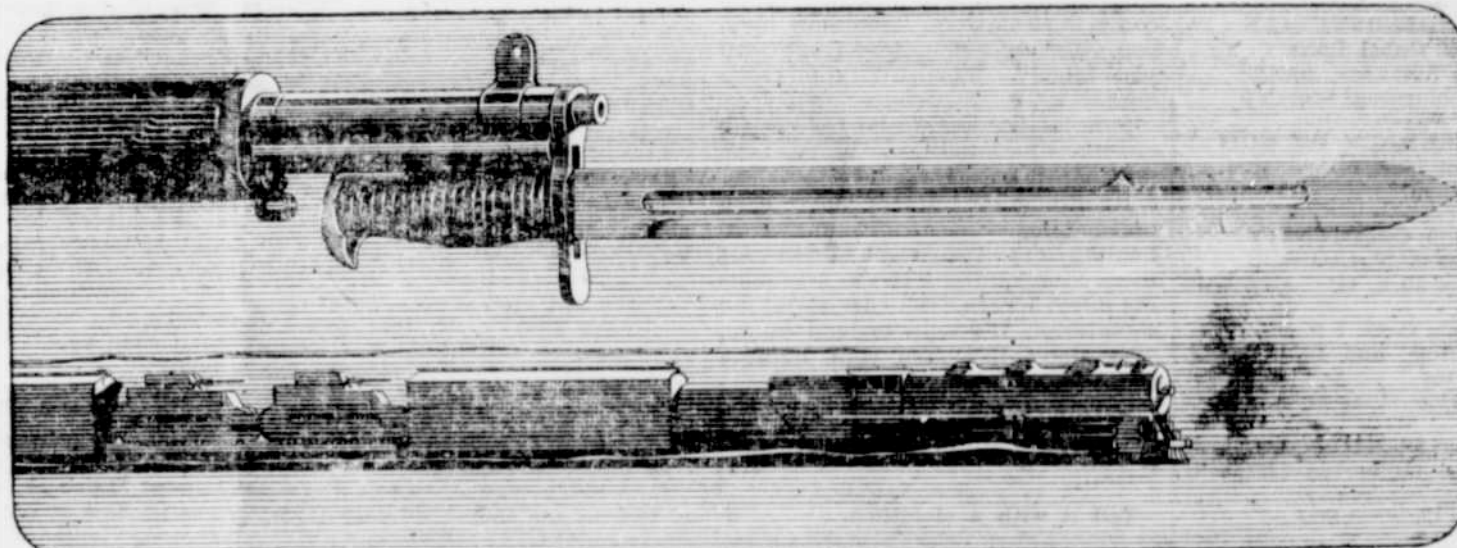
