Petitions to be Presented
To 1945 Oregon Legislature

A large amount of discussion of three important questions crystallized into the passing of three resolutions at the Symposium arranged by Mrs. George T. Gerlinger in Portland on last September 22. These resolutions in the form of petitions will be presented to the 1945 Oregon Legislature as follows: that they memorialize the next Congress to pass an amendment to the Constitution to limit the tenure of office of President of the United States, of any party, to two terms of four years each for the very good reasons set forth in the resolution; that they make a careful study of the Electoral College system of electing the President of the United States and that their conclusions if sufficiently unanimous be presented to the next session of Congress, where legislation about this matter is already pending; and the third resolution relates to making a suitable appropriation for statues of two most outstanding Oregon citizens to be placed in Statuary Hall, (or the Hall of Fame, as it is popularly called), in the nation's Capitol.

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Nazi Super-Roads
May Aid Invasion

More Than 4,000 Miles of
Them Cover the Reich.

WASHINGTON. — Many of nearly half of 8,500 projected miles of superhighways in Germany completed when in 1939 war forced suspension of the building program will facilitate the Allied invasion if all are not destroyed by the Nazis themselves or Allied artillery and air bombs.

These Reichsautobahnen (literal translation: Realm's auto tracks) are 78-foot-wide concrete esplanades, double three-lane ribbons with 15-foot parkway between, on the pattern of the Pennsylvania turnpike between Pittsburgh and Harrisburg, the National Geographic society says.

First of them accessible to United States forces was a spur from Aachen — pounded into surrender by Lieut. Gen. Courtney H. Hodges' First army — to Cologne, 40 miles to the northeast.

Others are within early range of American forces near Karlsruhe, where a main north-south route lies within seven miles of France's northeastern corner; westward near Saarbruecken, where a spur runs from the Ludwigshafen-Mannheim industrial center on the Rhine; and at Wesel, northwest of the Ruhr, 35 miles from Netherlands battlefields around Arnhem and Nijmegen.

Began in 1933, the German motor roads program was made the responsibility of railroad construction engineers.

Six principal routes form a superhighway grid in Germany. Two were north-south: Hamburg to Basel in the west, Stettin to Munich and Berchtesgaden in the east. The four west-to-east were to run from Hamburg to Koenigsberg, from Cologne to Frankfurt-on-the-Oder, from Cologne to Breslau, from Karlsruhe to Munich.

The program was acknowledged to be far in advance of Reich traffic needs. The first reason for it was to provide high-speed military roads to support blitz invasions of neighboring countries.

300 Jamaicans Quit Jobs
As Workers on U. S. Farms
PHOENIX, ARIZ. — About 300 Jamaicans — of some 800 who came to Arizona recently — have quit farm jobs and started for their homes, a farmers' representative said.

The workers apparently were dissatisfied with wages, the type of work and housing, said W. E. Springer, president of Agricultural War Commodities, Inc., a farmers' agency to contract labor.

Springer said the Jamaicans regarded cotton picking as "peon labor." They were paid 50c an hour for general farm work. Thirty-five of the workers, Springer said, left cotton fields because one of them was refused service at a bar because of his color.

The Jamaicans, imported into the United States by the war food administration to help in labor shortage areas and brought here at government expense, previously had been working in Michigan canning factories.

Bullet Helps Yank Find
Spot on Map of Leyte
WITH THE 24TH DIVISION, LEYTE.—A Japanese sniper solved a problem in geography for Sgt. Ernest Martin of Terre Haute, Ind., assigned to the map section of this division.

Sergeant Martin was seated before a large map tacked to an upright board propped against a palm tree, trying to locate the Leyte valley town of Alangalang on the map.

Suddenly there was the report of a sniper's gun and the zing of a bullet. It struck the map board and knocked it down. Martin hit the dirt while a patrol hunted down the sniper. Then he examined the map. The bullet had gone through the town of Alangalang.

Two Japanese-Americans

Hunt, Idaho, Bringing the total of Minidoka casualties to 26 killed and 58 wounded, the War Department has reported 3 killed and 12 wounded in action in France during late October and early November. Nine of the 25 have been killed in France.

Among those listed this week as killed was a former graduate of the Beaverton High School, Pvt. Shin Sato, son of Mr. and Mrs. Yoshinobu Sato, was reported killed in action on November 1 on the French front. A member of the 42nd Combat team, Pvt. Sato left for overseas duty in September of this year. He was 25 years old. After finishing Beaverton high school he attended Pacific College at Forest Grove, Oregon. He was prominent as an outstanding athlete in football.

Pfc. Roy Sato, a brother of Pvt. Shin, was reported wounded in action in France on October 30. Sato was sent overseas in August, 1944, and was a volunteer and member of 42nd Combat Team. He, also, was a graduate of Beaverton High School.
