7th War Loan Planned

Campaign Opens on Monday, May 14

Seventh war loan quota of \$289,000 has been assigned to the Beaverton area, according to word received this week from the Washington county war finance committee. Re-appointment of Jay Gibson and Mrs. Robert Summers as co-chairmen for the area was also announced.

Over all quota for Washington county will be \$2,062,000 in the campaign which is scheduled to open May 14. This is an increase of nearly 21 per cent over the sixth war loan goal of \$1,750,000.

Special emphasis is being given to series E Bonds during the seventh war loan, according to J. L. Searcy of Hillsboro, county drive chairman.

Washington county has been allocated the largest goal in history on this type of government security—\$1,122,000 or an increase of 60 per cent over the sixth war loan. Since the county sale of E bonds was short of this mark in the last campaign, workers are being asked to make a special effort to encourage purchases of these securities.

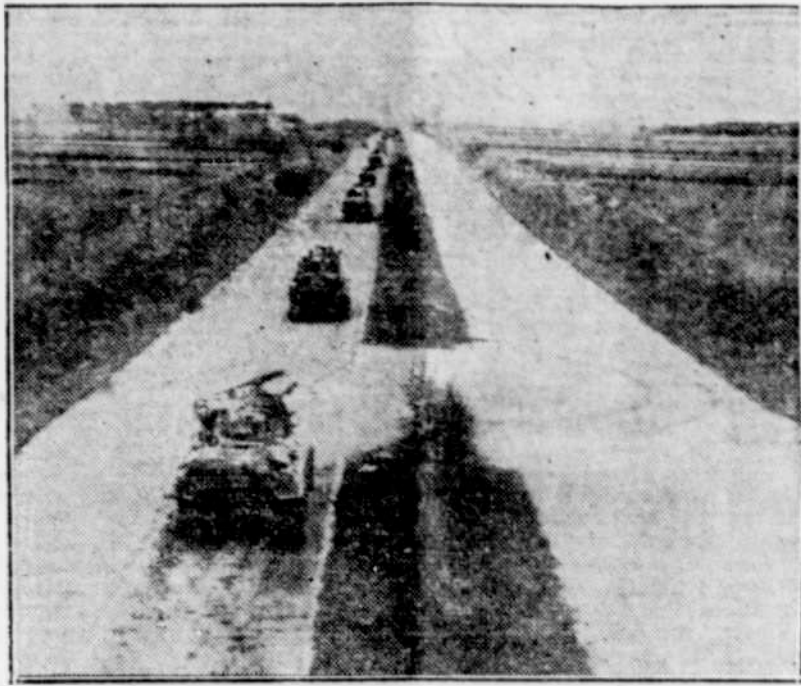
