Vacationers Should Watch Fires in Forest

Vacationers, expect to use the forest areas of Oregon in large numbers this week and all summer, will enter forest lands when the red warning flag of fire is flying, according to Edmund Hayes, chairman of the State Keep Oregon Green executive committee.

Intense heat of the past few weeks has dried out the grass and fuel in timber areas to create a real fire hazard. Many people will be enjoying the great outdoors on camping and picnicking trips who haven't been in the woods since the war. These people may forget what one careless match will do, or how much pure devilry one unguarded or improperly put out camp fire can cause.

Anyone seeing any strange objects should report them at once to the nearest police officer or fire warden and post a guard to make sure that any explosive device does no harm to unsuspecting adults or children.
