get out of debt; secondly, he will buy agricultural implements and make repairs to reduce his postwar costs; and thirdly, he will save money, through buying government bonds and accumulating a good bank account for the troublesome years which are ahead.

SPECIAL NOTE: The above message to farmers is all the more important now that Japan has surrendered. Do not be so jubilant about getting your boys home that they will find a farm burdened with debt or a father who has failed to recognize and prepare for the slump in certain agricultural prices which is bound to follow.

The entrance of Russia into the War and the surrender of Japan do not change my opinion on the investment outlook. I am still bullish on most common stocks, with the exception of shipping, airplanes and munitions. I am still bearish on the railroads and believe they will suffer with the one crop farmer.

Sanitary Tips

Article 3

Last week we discussed the housefly and its filthy habits. The next pest we will discuss, and probably man's greatest enemy of the animal world, is the rat. Since the beginning of recorded history, man has served as the unwilling host to the rat. Probably no other animal in the world lives, breeds, and feeds its family always at the expense of man and other animals.

Not only is the rat an expensive parasite to man but he carries some of man's worst diseases. Bubonic Plague, Typhus Fever, Infectious Jaundice, Trichinosis, rat-bite fever and food infections are among those diseases that have changed the fortunes of wars as well as taking tremendous toll of civilization time and again. These alone are justification for a continuous program of eradication. Rats may be temporarily controlled by trapping, poisoning, and fumigation, etc., but a permanent control is to be attained only by rat proofing which in the broadest sense embraces not only the exclusion of rats from buildings of all types but also the elimination of their hiding and nesting places and cutting off their food supply.

Rats may frequently gain access to rat-proof buildings—thru an open door, etc., but they cannot permeate there unless they find food and a safe retreat.

For further information regarding methods of rat proofing, etc., one may contact either the County Health Department or the County Agent.
