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NEED FOR WINTER-PROOFING EXPLAINED TO AUTO OWNERS

Seasonable Servicing and Check-up Essential to Keep Cars Running

"Time to Winter-proof your car, too!"

This is what Mobilgas dealers are telling motorists of this vicinity. By this they mean that it's not only time to check the moth balls out of furs and woollens, dig slickers from the closet and appraise the winter fuel supply, but it's time, they say, to check up and service the hot-weather-groggy auto and give it a chance to withstand bad weather driving ahead.

"Too few motorists," declares Geo. Henderson, Mobilgas and Mobiloil distributor in this area, "realize the damage that can be caused by neglect to service cars properly before rough winter weather sets in."

"It is particularly important that the proper weight lubricant be used that the season demands. Right now, before cold weather appears, a motor oil is required which will flow readily when the motor is started on cold mornings and gear lubricants are needed that will follow and cushion gears, make shifting easier and cut down strain and drag. Heavy summer oils and greases may stiffen with the cold and afford improper lubrication of vital parts with subsequent breakdowns and repair bills. "Car manufacturers — naturally intensely interested in the performance of their respective products — stress the need for periodic protective services such as repacking wheel bearings, changing transmission and differential lubricants and motor oil, chassis lubrication, flushing cooling system, renewing oil filter and generally checking and servicing other vital parts of the automobile."

"So you see that this seasonal check of cars is important. This we call 'Winter-proofing,' and Mobilgas dealers are equipped to give this vital service which is a wise precaution to help keep your car on the job until new ones are available."

Sanitary Sips

ARTICLE 8

The 1945 Legislature, among other things, changed the jurisdiction of Eating and Drinking Establishments from the State Department of Agriculture to the State Board of Health and to the County Health Department—where there is a local Health Unit. At the same time a new Sanitary Code was adopted.

This new sanitary code provides more rigid control over the eating and drinking establishments. A Restaurant License is now required of all places serving food to be consumed on the premises—this includes even the dipping of ice cream, since even this apparently simple operation is subject to sanitary hazards from several sources.

By January 1, 1946, all restaurants in the State of Oregon will be graded by the local or State inspectors, and the grade emblem will be prominently displayed—either on the door or in the front window of the restaurant. The inspection sheet will also be on display within the restaurant so that you may know the defects—both in equipment as well as the methods used in food handling.

The major change required under the new law is the proper sanitization of eating utensils by the use of either chlorine solutions, hot wa-

ter, boiling water, steam, or hot air. Most restaurants will use the hot water solution (170 deg. F. for 2 minutes). Most fountains will resort to chlorine solution which requires a three-compartment sink. All restaurants have been allowed until January 1, 1946, to provide satisfactory dishwashing facilities and to provide ice cream dipping containers that are supplied with running water. 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Neglect of Battery and Tires Spells Trouble for Motorists

To the motorist who is careless about the condition of his tires and battery at the start of the winter season, there is every chance of encountering trouble long before spring arrives.

This is the warning issued by George Henderson distributor for Mobil batteries and Federal tires in this area.

"The battery is asked to carry a much greater load in winter than in summer," declares Henderson. "It takes heavy punishment when starting the motor on cold mornings; and, in addition, with shorter days and longer nights, the greater need for lights increases the burden. With these conditions in mind, it is important to have the battery thoroughly checked before it fails completely and possibly at a critical moment."

"As for tires . . . to neglect these may invite trouble. That warning sign displayed on highways all through this area, reading, 'Slippery When Wet or Frosty,' means just that, and an incautious driver who ventures out with smooth tires during the bad weather period is risking a mishap. It isn't worth the chance with retread and other tire service available at Mobilgas stations. "To neglect either battery or tires is risky. Bay Windows on New S. P. Caboosees

Bay windows will replace the time-honored roof-top cupola on Southern Pacific's newest caboosees as the "look out" point from the rear of freight trains.

This innovation in design of the company's caboosees was made known today in the announcement that 50 all-steel wood-lined cars of this type have been ordered from the American Car and Foundry Co. at a total cost of approximately \$317,000. Deliveries are scheduled to start early next year.

Designed by the company's car construction engineer's the three-sided bay windows extend about one foot out from each side of the caboose to give trainmen a better vantage point from which to watch closely the operation of the train, according to L. E. McDonald, vice-president in charge of operations for the railroad.
