**British Plane Makes
Fastest Ocean Crossing**

LONDON. — The British air ministry announced recently that the fastest recorded east to west Atlantic crossing was made by a royal air force Mosquito recently when it flew from England to Newfoundland, about 2,300 miles, in 7 hours and 2 minutes. It was believed to have knocked five hours off the previous best time for the east to west crossing. The plane averaged 325 miles an hour.



IT'S SURPRISING—how War Bonds grow in value each year. If held until maturity they earn 3 1/2 per cent and they have a yearly added value. The chart tells its own story for a \$100 series E Bond. The scale to the left shows how a \$1,000 Series E Bond grows. The chart shows that the increase in value is greatest in the later years of the bond's life. Note how the rate of interest goes up in the second three years of the bond's life. Study the increase in the \$1,000 bond.
