NOTICE OF INTENTION TO
IMPROVE A PORTION OF
WASHINGTON STREET
NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that
the City of Beaverton, Washington
County, Oregon, did, on Jan. 7, 1946,
adopt a resolution declaring its in-
tention to improve a portion of Wash-
ington Street, the centerline of which
is described as follows:
Commencing at a point on the
South line of Fifth Street where
the centerline of Washington
Street intersects the same; thence
Southerly to a point 120 feet
South of the South line of Sev-
enth Street extended Westerly
from said Seventh Street as the
same is laid out in Matney's Ad-
dition.

by applying one-inch crushed rock
thereon to a depth of six inches,
eight feet on each side of the above
described centerline and by doing
such other work as is necessary to
place the street in a serviceable con-
dition and to constitute a complete
improvement, and to assess the cost
of said improvement against the
abutting property as provided by the
charter and ordinances of the City
of Beaverton.

It was also further resolved that
written objections or remonstrances
to said improvement may be filed at
any time on or before 5:00 p. m. on
the 4th day of February, 1946, at the
City Hall in Beaverton, Oregon.

You are further notified that on
the 31st day of January, 1946, the
resolution of January 7, 1946, was
amended by redeclaring the City's
intention to improve Washington
Street as above set forth, and the
date for the hearing of remonstran-
ces and objections to the said im-
provement was fixed as February 15,
1946.

All interested persons are hereby
notified to appear on or before said
date and make any and all objec-
tions or remonstrances that they
might have to the said proposed
street improvement.
