

OREGON STATE COLLEGE—This campus will soon resemble in spots an American military camp abroad when 20 Quonset huts are erected at various locations to serve as emergency classrooms and offices until permanent buildings can be erected. Purchase of the huts together with alterations of some parts of present buildings were authorized by the board of higher education.

The "igloo" type structures will be 20 by 48 feet. Each will provide two good sized class rooms or varying number of offices. They will be located close to existing buildings for convenience in connecting utilities, but mostly at inconspicuous points. Largest grouping will be on the vacant lot between the agricultural building and Waldo hall.

Extra room is essential if the college is to admit between 5500 and 6000 expected next fall.

TRAFFIC ACCIDENTS

Traffic accidents claimed a toll of 15 lives during the first ten days of March, Secretary of State Robert S. Farrell, Jr., said today in warning Oregon drivers and pedestrians that unsafe driving practices were contributing a heavy toll of death and injury this year.

"Final figures on fatalities for the month of February show 35 persons killed, an all-time high for that month in Oregon's history," Farrell declared. "Such unsafe practices as passing in the face of approaching traffic, speed too great for safety on curves and driving after drinking contributed to this tragic record."

The Secretary of state said that while vehicle defects played a part in the accident upswing so far this year, the greater proportion of the increase was due to unsafe driving and walking practices.

"The individual driver and pedestrian can prevent these accidents by accepting his full share of the responsibility for safety," Farrell declared.

New Rate Schedules

Filed Last Week by PEP

Filing of two new rate schedules with the Oregon public utilities commissioner last week will save general commercial, small industrial and large industrial customers of Portland General Electric company approximately \$327,000 annually, according to R. R. Easter, PGE's local manager.

The rate for general commercial and small industrial users will reflect estimated annual savings of \$249,000 and will affect 12,500 customers. It is effective with meter readings commencing April 24 and will cover consumption during the previous 30-day period. The rate reduction covers all PGE territory, urban as well as rural, except within the cities of Salem, West Salem, Woodburn, Silverton and Mt. Angel where rates were reduced previously.

Designed to attract new industrial load into the PGE area, the rate for large industrial power service affects customers having demands in excess of 3,000 kilowatts. Delivery under the schedule is at 57,000 volts and the effective date will be May 1. Possible savings total \$78,000 annually for existing eligible customers, agree to take service for at least five years.

Business firms billed under the new commercial rate will enjoy lower costs in most consumption brackets than users in either Seattle or substantially lower than those of San Francisco and Los Angeles. It was declared thus placing the Portland and upper Willamette valley area in a favored position over any of the large metropolitan areas of the Pacific Coast.

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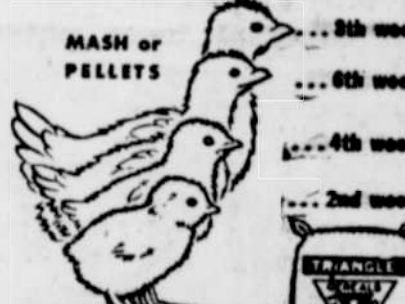
