Odeon will also include musical compositions, modern dance and exhibitions of original student work in painting, sculpture, ceramics and the fine arts.

FOUR-POINT FOOD FOR FAMINE
The greatest contribution that Oregon farm families can make to famine relief is to adjust production so as to grow and harvest the food and feed products most needed this year, according to a leaflet on the food-for-famine program just issued by the U. A. C. Extension service.
Full cooperation of farm homes in the food saving campaign is also emphasized in the leaflet with definite suggestions given, while a better garden on every farm is also shown to be highly important. Here is the four-point program suggested for Oregon in the leaflet now being widely distributed through the county extension offices:
1. Reduce the use of bread and other wheat foods by 40 per cent; and oils by 20 per cent. Stop waste.
2. Plant home and 4-H club gardens on a wartime basis.
3. Conserve by canning, freezing, storing and drying enough locally available food for the family.
4. Grow and harvest all food and feed products in line with Oregon's 1946 production goals.
