## Training Traffic Control Personnel OSC, June 17-18

Oregon cities may obtain trained personnel for traffic control programs by sending traffic police officers and members of city engineering staffs to the 8th National Institute for Traffic Training, to be held on the Oregon State College campus June 17-23, according to Secretary of State, Robert S. Farrell, Jr.

Farrell's office is assisting in arrangements for the Institute which will draw students from eleven western states for the one-week and two-week courses in traffic training. The courses would include traffic police operations, traffic engineering, school transportation, driver training, accident records and their uses and public education for safety. Registration is open to municipal, county, state police and engineers. Registration blanks may be obtained from the office of Robert S. Farrell, Jr., Secretary of State, or from Prof. Bob Glenn, Oregon State College, Corvallis, Oregon.

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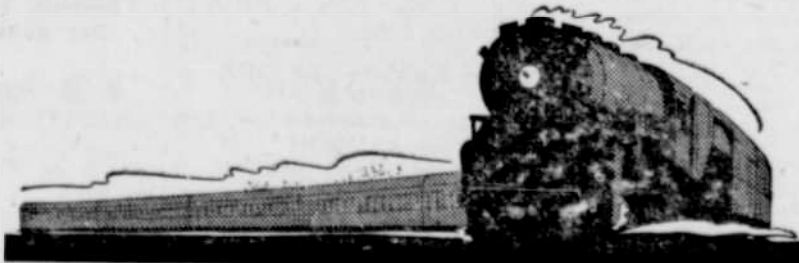
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
