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West Slope Is Growing

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'Go Fly A Kite; Reduce Surplus

Portland—The War Assets administration today urged the populace to go fly a kite—130,000 of them in fact—for it has that many in its surplus stocks. Diamond shaped with a five-foot span and five feet high, they have twin control lines to make them dive and maneuver like airplanes. They were designed for use as targets for aerial gunnery crews. But, they must be bought in lots of ten at \$2.79 each f.o.b. out of several storage points in the country.

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
