May Traffic Toll

The Oregon traffic death toll for the month of May stood at 36 fatalities today, an increase of 16 percent over the toll of 31 killed in May of 1945, Secretary of State Robert S. Farrell, Jr., disclosed.

During the first five months of 1946, a total of 180 persons lost their lives in Oregon traffic accidents, an increase of 50 percent over the 120 fatalities reported for the first five months of 1945.

Of the 36 persons killed in Oregon traffic in May, 28, or 77 percent died in accidents on rural highways.

"The heavy toll in rural areas indicates the part speed too great for conditions is playing in our rising accident trend," Farrell declared. "In virtually every rural accident, speed too great for safety is a factor. Cars go off the road on curves, are involved in accidents while attempting to pass other cars on the straight-a-way, or try to pass

Botulism Made Harmless If Foods Are Boiled

Botulism poisoning, probably the most dreaded type of food poisoning and which kills from one to three persons a year in Oregon, can be easily and positively eliminated simply by making sure that canned food in which it occurs is boiled 10 minutes before tasting as soon as the can or jar is opened.

This is the warning given by G. V. Copson, head of the bacteriology department at Oregon State college, as this year's canning season starts. While botulism has been reported at least once in almost every food, about 90 per cent of all cases have resulted from canned string beans and asparagus used cold as in a salad, and in canned corn that was warmed but not boiled, he added.

"The real danger of botulism is that it strikes so seldom that people become careless in preparation of canned food," Copson explained. "Because the deadly bacteria which causes botulism are so abundant in Oregon soil, constant care is needed. Nationally

"Motor vehicles today are in the worst condition in all history. 'Super Chicken' Goal Of Oregon Poultry Breeders

Ross Hart, of Beaverton, is Washington County's entrant in the Oregon section of the national Chicken-of-Tomorrow contest, N. L. Bennion of Oregon State Agricultural College, chairman of the state contest committee, has announced. More than 1,200 chickens have been entered by Oregon poultry breeders.

The best of these birds will be displayed and judged at the dressed poultry show to be held on Thursday, June 27, at the Poultry Building of Oregon State College, Corvallis, in connection with the annual meeting of the Oregon Baby Chick Association. By competing in the state contest, all contestants will be eligible for the \$5,000 national championship award or part of the \$3,000 in regional prizes to be awarded in 1948 by A & P Food Stores, which initiated the three-year breeding program.

Bennion said the objective of the contest is to encourage poultrymen to develop meatier chickens which will have at least 10 per cent more meat in relation to bone structure, combining this added meatiness with higher egg-laying ability.

known commercially canned products have never been reported as causing botulism."

It is not safe to depend on odor or off flavor to reveal botulism contamination, the bacteriologist warns. Eating just one string bean that appeared normal caused the death of a woman who sampled a can before cooking the beans for the family, which ate them without injury after they were boiled. Half an olive has also proved fatal.

Following correct, conscientious canning methods is the first step in eliminating death from botulism, and the next is making sure that home canned susceptible foods are boiled 10 minutes as soon as opened and before they are even tasted, he concluded. If leftovers are put away for a few days, it is safest to boil them again.

Help Keep Oregon Green, Avoid Carelessness

Oregon forest and range lands may become silhouetted against the background of smoke and flames any time from now to the end of what may well be our most dangerous fire season in two decades. This is the message sent Mr. James Lewis, Washington County Chairman of the Keep Oregon Green committee, by Dean Paul Dunn, state head of the fire prevention organization.

Calling upon the local county leader to 'get his house in order and be prepared for any emergency', Chairman Dunn pointed out that an unseasonal lack of rain during April had created a bad fire situation over most of Oregon.

Governor Earl Snell, working closely with Keep Oregon Green organizations in every county, has further strengthened the local groups by naming a strong group of newspapermen and radio leaders in Oregon to insure a drive all summer and until fall rains come. Likewise at Eugene May 3rd, loggers from Western Oregon at their annual gathering, recognized the critical state of extreme danger existing in our forests, agreed to have one of their boss loggers in each of the 18 Western Oregon counties serve on the county Keep Oregon Green committee to organize all logging operations on an alert basis.

"With increased tourist travel certain to pour thousands of city folk and others not familiar with fire danger into our woods,"
