Willamette Valley Limestone

Farms of the Willamette Valley continually require a large quantity of limestone to neutralize acidity and to provide calcium for crops. The amount of limestone which a farmer can use depends mainly on cost and one of the principal factors in this cost is transportation. Most of the limestone used in the Willamette Valley is now brought in by railroad from deposits in eastern and southern Oregon, because these deposits are much higher grade than known Willamette Valley deposits. If high-grade limestone could be found in the Willamette Valley, transportation cost would be lowered and farmers could use more of the needed limestone.

These facts together with descriptions of Willamette Valley deposits are discussed in a short report just issued by the State Department of Geology and Mineral Industries, entitled "Reconnaissance Geology of Limestone Deposits in the Willamette Valley, Oregon." It is No. 15 of the series of G.M.I. Short Papers. The author is John Elliot Allen, geologist of the Department staff.

The report is available at the office of the Department at 702 Woodlark Building, Portland, and the field offices at Baker and Grants Pass.

Household Hints

A SILVER LINING
One of the ways to keep silver bright and shiny, so Westinghouse home economists have found, is to line the drawer in which it is kept with dark outing flannel.

Contrast Makes A Meal Successful

While good food value unquestionably comes first in planning meals, Mrs. Julia Kiene, director of the Westinghouse Home Economics Institute, believes that an ounce of "contrast" is worth a pound of persuasion in putting over "what's good for you." As one means to that end, serve at least one dish that's different from the rest. For example: a cool salad or frozen dessert with a hot meal; a hot soup or scalloped vegetable with a cold meal.

Partly A Matter Of Inches

For best results on washday, you're advised to use water at the right temperature (and preferably fresh water for each tubful of clothes), and a good suds. The latter is a matter of inches rather than guesswork, for a laundress' manual published by Westinghouse Home Economics Institute, states that top of water should be completely covered with from two to three inches of suds.

Beet Tops Furnish Nutritive Plus

Early beets are usually sold with the tops on, and in advising you to eat both, Westinghouse home economists point out that beet tops offer a nutritive "plus" not found in the beets themselves. The tops, in common with other leafy greens, are particularly high in Vitamin A, B2, and Iron, and also give some Vitamin B1. Beets belong to the so-called "reserve crops" foods which furnish additional vitamins and minerals.

Package Frozen Foods Correctly

Because it is inadvisable to re-freeze foods once thawed, containers for home-freezing should be selected with the size of the family in mind. On the basis of more than three years of continuous research, the Westinghouse Home Economics Institute recommends a pint carton for three large servings or four small servings of most vegetables; a quart container for five to six generous servings. Larger containers are not recommended for average-size families. Not only are they wasteful of food but of storage space.

Enrollment Still Possible At EOC; New Dorm.

An addition to Dorion Hall dormitory is now under construction and will be ready for occupancy for the fall term. The addition will make it possible to house 168 students in the Hall. Also to be constructed will be an emergency dormitory to house 64 students. Fifty trailer houses, in addition to the forty apartments now occupied, will be available to married veterans. Applications for admittance are still being accepted by the college.

Wet Weather Hard On Hay Crop

Continued wet weather has resulted in a very serious hay situation according to Roy L. Davidson, Farm Labor Assistant. There is hay in all stages of harvesting in Washington county in the swath, windrow, and in the shock. This cut hay is suffering considerable damage by the damp weather while the uncut acreage is getting overripe. Hay has been at a standstill during the last week or two with the result that the Farm Labor Office will be swamped with calls for help, once clear weather permits resumption of hay harvest. The office already has many orders on file asking for hay hands when the weather clears.

Farmers Planning Conservation

Further substantial progress toward accomplishing Oregon's huge soil and water conservation job will be made this year, reports E. Harvey Miller, chairman of the state FMA committee, in announcing intended participation in the 1946 agricultural conservation program.

Farm plans requesting participation in the conservation program have been filed for 33,500 Oregon farms and ranches, Miller reported. Tabulations have been completed for 29,171 of the total number of cooperating farms, showing an intended performance of conservation practices costing more than \$10,000,000 and for which practice payments would amount to \$5,000,000.

This figure is considerably more than the \$2,813,000 available to Oregon for 1946 practice payments, the FMA chairman pointed out. But he asked farmers not to let this situation deter them from carrying out needed conservation projects. If the present allocation will not cover performance completed next fall, then additional funds will be requested and all available funds will be prorated to cooperators in accordance with the work completed in each county, Miller said.
