Grapple Fork Handles Baled Hay In Jig Time

A grapple fork for baled hay that will pick up eight small or six large bales at a time is described in a new station circular No. 169 just issued by the O. S. C. Experiment station. The device, designed in the agricultural engineering department, is for use in transferring baled hay from a truck or wagon to the mow in a barn or to a stack.

In using the fork eight times or hooks, four on each side of a main frame, are inserted in the bales as they rest end to end on the load. No moving or piling of the bales is necessary.

Early fears that an excessive number of bales would be broken did not prove to be the case. By building up a pile early directly beneath the track the distance the
