In addition, 35 officer WAVES have requested retention until July 1, 1947 and 6 have volunteered for duty until January 1, 1947.

The peak of the employment of WAVES in the Thirteenth Naval District was reached in April, 1945 when 2700 enlisted and 300 officer WAVES were on duty.
