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Nancy Holmes SUGGESTS



MAYBE they're not so easy on the eye — the breakfasts that Pop and young son concoct themselves — but it's he-man stuff and it hits the spot. There may be a few more dirty pots and pans than usual, the kitchen may look as though a cyclone just passed through, but it lets Mom sleep late. Everybody's happy. What else matters?

Just in case there are a few father-son combinations that need a helping hand to guide their first culinary efforts, Nancy Holmes of the Best Foods kitchens suggests:

Dad's Bacon and Eggs

12 slices bacon Salt and pepper
8 eggs Paprika

Place bacon flat in skillet or on grill and brown slowly on one side. Turn. Place strips close together in pairs. Break an egg on each pair. Season with salt, pepper and paprika. When egg begins to set, turn bacon with egg, if desired, or baste with hot fat and cook to desired hardness. Yield: 6 servings.

Lumber Camp Flap Jacks

1 cup enriched flour 1 tablespoon sugar
2 cups cornmeal 2 eggs molasses
1 teaspoon salt 2 eggs 2 cups sour milk
2 teaspoons baking powder 6 tablespoons melted vitaminized margarine
1 teaspoon soda

Sift, measure flour and resift with rest of dry ingredients. Break in eggs. Add sour milk and stir until dry ingredients are moistened. Stir in melted vitaminized margarine. Bake on ungreased griddle in large cakes. Yield: fifteen 4 1/2 inch cakes.
